# Obituary

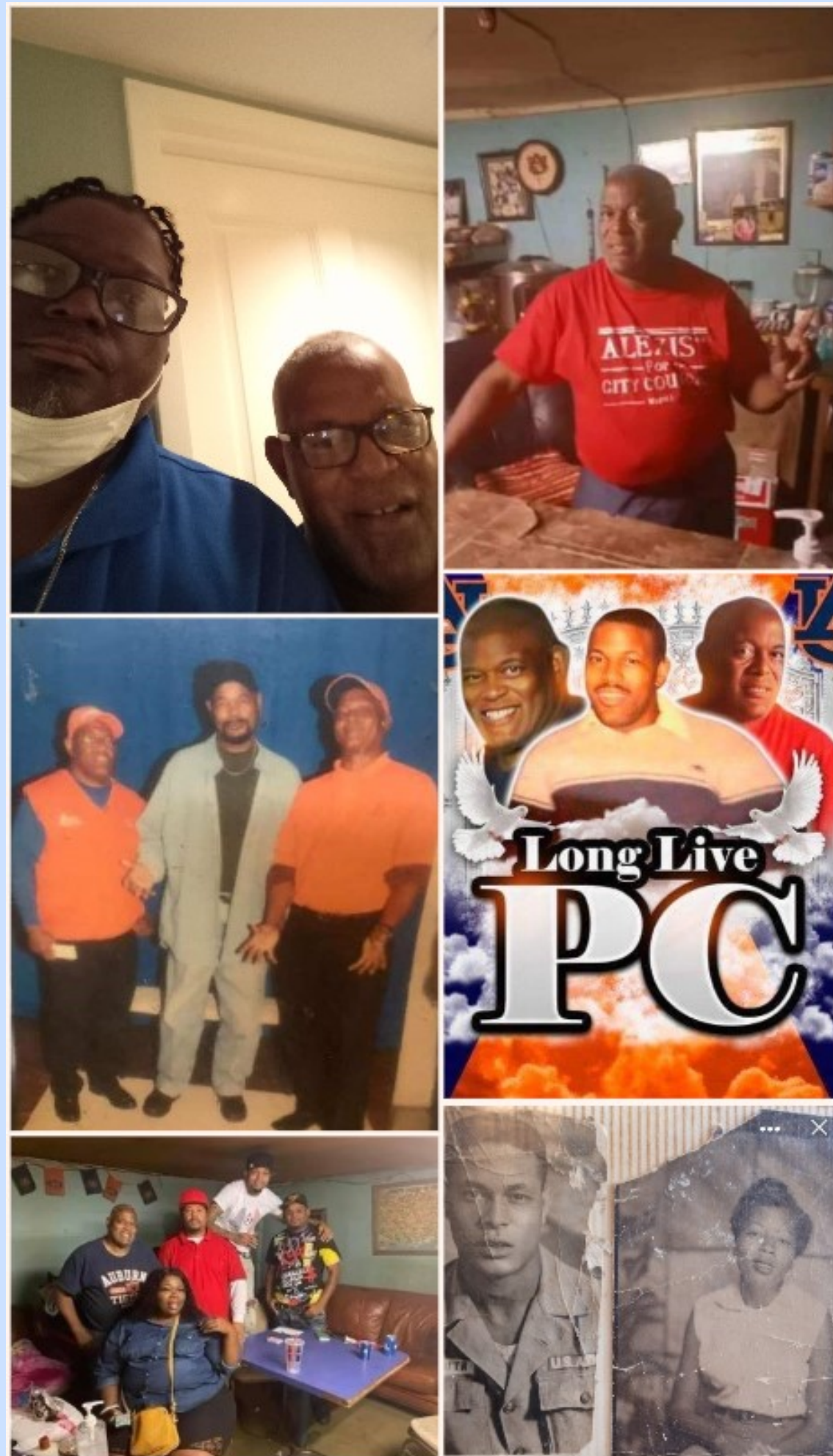
