She was married to David Lee Taylor on December 2, 2017.

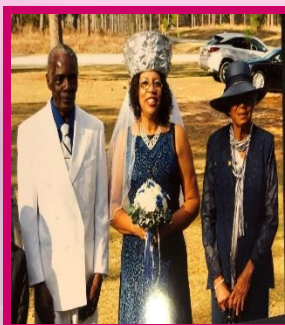
Preceding her in death are her father, Charlie Spicer, Sr. and brother, Willie Floyd Williams.
