



MR. ROBERT MCDADE BURTON, son of the late Robert and Beatrice Burton McDade, was born October 3, 1940, in Montgomery County, Alabama. Robert was lovingly reared by his maternal grandparents, the late Ocie and Katie Burton, in Cecil, Alabama. After graduating from Georgia Washington High School in Mt. Meigs, Alabama, Robert moved to Tuskegee to live with his cousin, the late Ocie Burton, Sr., and Fadie Bell Crenshaw Burton. During this time, Robert matriculated at The Commonwealth College of Sciences in Houston, Texas. He successfully completed the prescribed course of mortuary science for graduation in recognition of this attainment as a professional embalmer in February of 1964. Robert served his country in the United States Army during the Vietnam Conflict. After receiving an honorable discharge, he returned to Alabama before moving to California.

He married the late Evangelyne Maxine Howard Burton, and this union was blessed with two sons, Howard and Kelvin.

Being the product of two communities, Robert was affiliated with St. Paul Baptist Church of Cecil, Alabama, as were his grandparents, and Mount Olive Baptist Church of Tuskegee, along with his cousin/father figure, Ocie Burton, Sr., and his wife. Robert was appointed a member of the Mount Olive Baptist Church Board of Trustees. He was a very dedicated member, having also served on the building committee for the current edifice.

Robert and Maxine purchased McKenzie's Funeral Home in 1981. As a businessman, Robert devoted more than 58 years of service to the funeral industry, serving families of East Alabama and surrounding areas. Washington Consistory #115 of Masons, and Mizraim Temple #119 Order of Shriners.

He was preceded in death by one brother, Sylvester McDade, and two sisters, Deliah Pierce and Dorothy Glover. Mr. Robert M. Burton entered eternal rest on Wednesday, February 9, 2022, at Baptist Medical Center South in Montgomery, Alabama.


