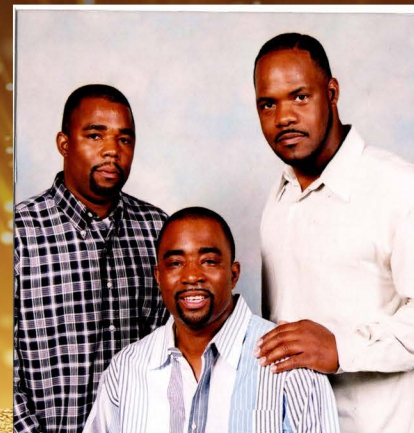
# OBITUARY
