Remembering Dwayne

Dwayne Milton McCullough was born in Catawba County, North Carolina on June 28, 1952 to the late Lucius Calvin McCullough and Norva Mundy McCullough. He made his transition early Saturday morning, August 13, 2022, in the comfort of his home.

He joined Browns Chapel United Methodist Church at an early age.

Dwayne graduated in 1970 from Bandy’s High School in Catawba, NC and attended Barber Scotia College in Concord, NC. He was drafted into the US Army and served in Vietnam and Panama.
