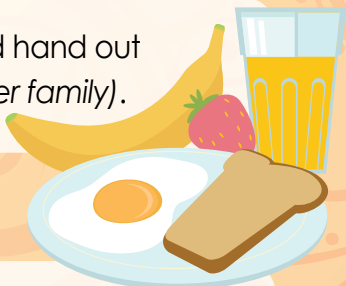


This Month's Topic: DO OVER, PLEASE

Serve breakfast and hand out raffle tickets (*one per family*).

Have moms introduce their kids and say, "I'm proud of (*child's name*) this month because..."

3

Say this before the video starts:
"Do you get discouraged when you make a mistake, or when you keep making the same mistake?"



We all do! Today we'll learn about three simple words, "Do over, please," that can help our kids, and us, make the most of second chances. Here's Abby to tell us how it works."

After the video, say "I wonder if Abby has had a chance to use "Do over, please." yet? And the Think About It printable will also help us do even better the next time, right? In fact, this week's Mom Time Challenge is finding a way to use the Think About It Printable. But first, let's talk about mistakes and do overs."

Give out the discussion cards or show the questions on your PowerPoint presentation and have the moms and children answer them together for a few minutes.

Give the moms their Mom Time Challenge: Get ready to Think About It! We can get better at the Think About It part of this week's topic by using the Think About It printable. Even if your child doesn't do a single thing wrong this month, you can still sit down and talk about the printable using a problem your child has had in the past.

Raffle & Wrap Up - Raffle off your prizes and then thank the mothers and kids for coming, give them the next meeting date, and encourage them to invite a friend.



BONUS ACTIVITY - Now we're going to get really good at asking for a "Do over, please." On the count of three, everyone yell as loudly as you can, "Do over, please!" Ready, 1, 2, 3! ... "Do over, please!"
