

Letter from Fr. Beau

Dear Parishioners,

The summer is flying by – and I wanted to give you an update on 4 projects that are underway.

1. Kern Center (Gym): We are in the middle of the Kern Center renovation. Last month we repainted the gym's interior, updating the color and freshening up the appearance. The lighting has been changed to LED, giving greater brightness and longevity to our bulbs (that are difficult to change at the ceiling's height).



This week we begin installation of a new gym floor. The wear and tear on the original floor led to holes in the floor that needed to be filled. The repairs never looked the same as the original appearance. Our new floor is a poured floor that will look great and provide greater traction and safety when our kids play sports.

The Kern Center is where we gather as a community, and the update will enhance our gatherings as a parish family.

2. The Organ / Choir area: World-wide manufacturing delays are slowing completion of Church organs. Once the necessary parts are in, they will ship the organ to us. We'll get there soon! We will begin renovation of the choir area in the church August 1.

3. The New School Security Fence: We received bids and are ready to move forward on the security fence for our school. This fence will add another layer of protection to the Annex classrooms, the Kern Center and the Pre-K playground.

4. Campus lighting: We are in the process of changing all lights in the church, gym and school areas to LED lighting. This project is being partially funded by a grant from Entergy. LED lighting will greatly improve energy costs to the parish and school, improve visibility around the campus, and increase the longevity of the bulbs.

As always, thank you for your strong support of our parish mission. Know that Fr. Lawrence and I pray for you daily!





FAITH FORMATION

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Be Careful What You Ask For

Jesus talks about praying for whatever we need with faith and confidence, but he ends by asking, "How much more with the Father . . . give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?" (Luke 1:13). Is he saying there are limits to what we can ask for? "Be careful what you ask for," the saying warns. Just because we want something doesn't mean it will be good for us. But if we have enough faith to pray for something, we probably would not pray for anything evil. So what is Jesus really saying? He is giving us two lessons about prayer. First, he assures us that God does hear our prayers and answers them. Many people take "ask and you shall receive" so literally that they expect God to do their bidding no matter what they want. But God is free to do what is best for us, free to answer some prayers with a no when what we seek is against God's will. So maybe our first prayer should be to ask God to show us what we really need. That leads us to the second lesson: prayer changes us, not God. If we truly pray as Jesus prayed, we would say, "Not as I will, but as you will" (Matthew 26:39). It's not easy to change our minds about what we want or need. To change our desires from selfish to holy takes a lot of power, the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus was raised from the dead by that power and we will be, too (Romans 8:11). So when Jesus promises that the Father will give the Spirit to us for asking, the Spirit is both the source of and the answer to our prayers. Let us ask the Spirit to empower us to desire and pray for what we really need.

SAINT MARTHA (FIRST CENTURY) - JULY 29

Whether you find Martha Stewart admirable or annoying, she has the perfect patron saint. Luke describes Martha--saint, not Stewart--as "burdened with much serving" (Luke 10:40). About Mary, seated, listening to Jesus, Martha complained, "Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?" Jesus' response, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things . . . Mary has chosen the better part" (10:41, 42), suggests to some the superiority of the contemplative life, leaving the rest of us, supporting families, earning livings, (helping others?), as "second-class" Christians. But Luke introduces Martha and Mary immediately after Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan, whom Jesus recommends as a model of practical compassion, concluding, "Go and do likewise" (10:37). Go and do! Sit and listen! Discipleship is never either/or but both/and. Jesus ministered in prayerful silence and hospitable service. Monastic calendars add Martha's sister Mary and brother Lazarus, calling all three "hosts of the Lord," recalling their welcome of Jesus to their home in Bethany, reminding us Whom we welcome whenever we extend summertime hospitality!


