From the Desk of Deacon Tom...

Our second reading doesn't always connect to the theme of the weekend, but this weekend is one of those where all the readings speak about being humble. I like hearing our readers at Mass proclaim the second reading. They can many times be only 2-3 sentences but they seem to run on forever, making them challenging to proclaim effectively. I was talking to someone last weekend about this, and how blessed I am to get to read the Gospel at Mass. It's a lot easier to read the words of Jesus than the writings of St. Paul, not to mention it's also a LOT more humbling and such a privilege.

But back to today's reading from St Paul. When I first read it, St Paul seems to be calling the people he's speaking to....how should I say it? Not smart. "Not many of you were wise by human standards." I relate to what he talks about today. When I was in formation to be ordained a Deacon, I always felt that I wasn't knowledgeable enough about the faith when I watched me peers and classmates. Even after being ordained over eight years now, I still feel like I know so little about the faith, scripture, preaching, being pastoral, you name it. I know I'm much further along than when I started this path, yet there is so much about our faith that no one can know everything. And God is always looking for more. Then putting what you know into practice is even more challenging. In the business world, we call it "Continuous Improvement." If you aren't getting better, the business is failing. Standing still is not an option or a path to survivability. So I'm right in that mix of the middle part of the reading: God chose: ...the foolish....the weak... the lowly....those who count for nothing. Look at the selection of the disciples. He started by choosing fishermen. Those guys turned out to become pretty great! Just by hanging around with Jesus.

Several years ago, someone came to me and said that there were some folks in my parish at the time that felt like they could not measure up to the holiness they witnessed in others. So their answer was "why should I try?" I ended up taking that topic into a homily. Why try? Because God knows your circumstances, your background, your environment, your upbringing, and most of all your heart. No one else knows your heart except you and God. So the reason to try is simple...that's all He asks of us. To become as great as He made us to be. Not to be as great or as good as someone else. We can't coast thinking "God understands, He'll just give me a pass." It's in the effort that God is revealed to us, in trying to get closer to Him in all that we do in our lives.

Beginning the end of February, and continuing throughout the Lenten season, we are excited to offer *Presence: The Mystery of the Eucharist* - an adult faith study on the Most Blessed Sacrament presented by Augustine Institute.
