Happy Easter! Yes, it's still Easter, so the greeting still applies.

Today's Gospel mentions "the Advocate" being sent to the disciples. I remember several years ago I used that term in reference to the Holy Spirit in a group gathering and someone asked me afterword what that referred to and where I got the reference. Took me a little bit to find it, but it was a great interaction for me. It was one of the early questions I got during my formation and helped me do a bit of research and share some new info with another Catholic. We further found that the source of that word is Parakletos, or what we may know better as Paraclete. I used to think that was a set of baseball shoes (Dad joke! Pair o' cleates – sorry.)

Back when I was first in formation, I was looking for something to do in the Parish during the summer when my classes ended. My Spiritual Director mentioned that the Diocesan Tribunal was looking for Field Advocates. Not knowing anything about it, I volunteered! Now that's not in my nature at all, but I figured I had a lot to learn and needed to experience as much as I could. The Field Advocate was a role to meet with those seeking an annulment to their marriage, or those whose spouse was seeking an annulment. After some training, I had a few people contact me in this newly established role.

It was quite an experience meeting with and listening to the stories of those looking for the church to grant them an annulment. One of my Deacon classmates had also gotten an annulment to his first marriage and described the process as the "best kept secret in the Catholic Church". I found it's not without emotion, particularly for those re-living the pain that can come from the stories that accompany their journey. But with pain comes healing. And I found that being an Advocate was equally challenging and rewarding. I had to re-live these experiences with each of those that I worked with. But it gave me a great perspective on the Holy Spirit as the Paraclete, or Advocate.

The definition of Advocate is "to publicly recommend or support". Our faith tells us we need to have compassion for all those we meet. Compassion is to "suffer together". Being an Advocate and experiencing those stories showed me the truth of compassion. That's the Holy Spirit that Jesus talks about in today's Gospel. The Advocate journeys with us, leading us in God's truth and suffering with us in our individual journeys of faith. One of the best definitions I saw was that the spiritual definition of compassion is "acting to alleviate the suffering of others." May we turn to the Advocate in our times of need and rely on the Holy Spirit that Jesus promises us.
