#### From Our Parish Evangelist...

I'm writing this letter with the hope that the dog days of summer are behind us. Even with such modern miracles as backyard swimming pools and central air conditioning, the oppressive heat of a few weeks ago can still be difficult to escape. Perhaps you may have noticed that the heat has been turned up in the Sunday Gospels recently, as well... what a coincidence! A few weeks ago we had servants being beaten (both severely and lightly); last Sunday we had the world on fire and households divided; and this week we hear of the narrow gate and the locked door - with those left outside wailing and grinding their teeth. Hot fun in the Summertime!

These passages tend to make us feel uncomfortable. We'd rather be back in the air conditioning - where Jesus paid the price for all of our sins. The comfortable assurance that we are all redeemed, forgiven, and sanctified through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Yet the sultry, oppressive heat is still there, isn't it? Temptation, disordered desires, selfishness, pride. And no matter how insulated we are, it always seems to find its way in - or more often, we eventually have to go out and deal with it face-to-face.

Jesus loves me and He saved me. He continues to intercede for me at the right hand of God the Father. He gives me the Holy Spirit to strengthen me and make me holy. So what gives with all the doom and gloom talk in these Gospels? It's simple - He knows I can mess it all up. He knows I have a bad habit of putting myself before Him and before my neighbors. He knows that to follow Him isn't easy - that's why He gave us His Grace in Word and Sacrament. That's why He gave us the Holy Spirit. That's why He gave us the Church. But even with all that help - I still mess it up. I still choose myself over Him. I know Him, but I don't accept Him - I don't love Him the way He loves me.

And when that fateful day comes, when my soul and my body part ways, I will come to the door: 'Lord - it's me... it's Brandon! Open up!'

Will He know me? Sure He will. He made me. Will He deny me? I sure hope not. But then again, how many times have I denied Him? How many times is too many?

That's a trick question - the love and mercy of God is beyond all limits or measure. The real question is, will I accept it? I accept it through repentance and charity. I accept it by taking up my cross and walking with Him. I accept it by forgiving others as I have been forgiven. I accept it by loving as He loves.

It's important to remember something when we encounter these heavy-handed Scripture passages: God doesn't kick us out of the air conditioning. We do that. We make the decisions that bring the intolerable heat - not Him. So while Summer is still here, let's strive to enter the narrow gate together. Let's love recklessly and forgive unconditionally. Let's beat the heat and stay cool.
