From the Desk of Deacon Tom

Happy Advent 2020! Wait – that's how I started my last Bulletin column in 2020. It's been almost a year since I've gotten to write anything. It may not be Advent yet, but sadly for me, Fall began this week...which just means Summer is over and Winter is coming. I bet for many of you, Fall is your favorite season, but mine is Summer, so I try to hold on to it as long as I can. I'm hoping this year might be different for me since I've invested in some new power equipment for my yard that will help with the "benefits" of fall (leaves) and winter (snow).

So "investment" is my key word this weekend. I've got a heavy investment into my Parish commitments this weekend. This Bulletin column. I'm preaching at all the masses (you've been warned). And I get to make two new Catholics this weekend (with God's help of course) by baptizing two infants.

Our second reading this weekend comes from the Letter of James and it's quite a downer. Your wealth has rotted away. Your clothes are moth-eaten. Your gold and silver have corroded. A bit of a fire and brimstone speech from James about focusing on investments that are fleeting. None of these are bad, but if we don't also invest in our spiritual life, it's all for nothing. Eternity is a really, really long time. Longer than we get on this earth. However, the great thing about investing in our salvation, unlike our 401(k), is that the outcome of the investment isn't predicated on starting early. That's not to mean we get to wait until the last minute either, because that's pretty risky. But if you start your 401(k) late, you've got to catch up on deposits to have something worthwhile when the need arises. Our spiritual life investment can be small and incremental. It just needs attention. Ignoring it for too long can make the recovery path even more challenging. If you are reading this, you are already doing something about your spiritual investment – not that my words are life changing - just that you've grabbed a bulletin and decided to look at it. Probably during my homily.

There is a lot going on in the Parish now that we've rebooted. There's bacon on Sunday (YAY!). But there is also a lot more to be done and many ways to plug in, even if it's a minimal investment. Find a way that works for you to get active in something within the parish, no matter how small. That investment will help not only the life of the parish continue to thrive, but your spiritual journey as well.
