# **Synod of Bishops**

The diocesan phase of a two-year Synod of Bishops (2021–2023) begins this Sunday. The theme for this worldwide event is synodality itself: "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission." Synodality can be roughly translated as "walking together." This Synod of Bishops is meant to help the whole Church come together to listen, reflect, discern, and discuss where God is leading us—not for the purpose of changing doctrine, but rather to help each person to carry out the Church's mission more effectively. To mark the opening of the diocesan phase of the Synod of Bishops, special prayers will be used at Masses this weekend and red vestments will be worn.

# "The Surging Joy which Moves Me": A Holy Hour in Honor of the North American Martyrs

The parish's next monthly holy hour will take place on Tuesday, October 19 from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. The format will be Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction, and will include the Office of Readings from the Liturgy of the Hours.

The holy hour will be dedicated to Sts. John de Brébeuf, Isaac Jogues, and their companions. These six French Jesuit priests and two religious brothers evangelized the Huron tribes, and were later martyred by the Iroquois. The North American Martyrs were killed between 1642 and 1649 in present-day Canada and New York state. Fr. John de Brébeuf expressed, movingly, a desire for martyrdom in his diary: "My beloved Jesus, and because of the surging joy which moves me, here and now I offer my blood and body and life."

## PARISH LIFE

#### Marriage in the Church

"The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life and which is ordered by its nature to the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring, has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament between the baptized" (Code of Canon Law, canon 1055 §1).

In order for a Catholic to be validly married, he or she must be married in the Church; that is, in the presence of a bishop, priest, or deacon—unless a dispensation has been obtained (canon 1108 §1). Being married in the Church does not require that a Catholic's spouse be or become a Catholic.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that, "Since marriage establishes the couple in a public state of life in the Church, it is fitting that its celebration be public, in the framework of a liturgical celebration, before the priest (or a witness authorized by the Church), the witnesses, and the assembly of the faithful" (no. 1663).

I am happy to assist any couple who is married only civilly to be prepared for matrimony in the Church (tmarques@richmonddiocese.org).


#### **Cathedral Social Justice Ministry in Action:** CARITAS
