# **Deacon's Ministry**

According to the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, which contains the norms for the celebration of Mass, "After the Priest, the Deacon, in virtue of the sacred Ordination he has received, holds first place among those who minister in the celebration of the Eucharist. ... At Mass the Deacon has his own part in proclaiming the Gospel, from time to time in preaching God's Word, in announcing the intentions of the Universal Prayer, in ministering to the Priest, in preparing the altar and in serving the celebration of the Sacrifice, in distributing the Eucharist to the faithful, especially under the species of wine, and from time to time in giving instructions regarding the people's gestures and posture" (no. 54; see also nos. 116, 171, 178–179, 181–182, 184).

The deacon's role at Mass expresses his identity as a servant (the meaning of the term "deacon"). A deacon's ministry (Greek: diakonia) is threefold: service in the liturgy (worship), service to the Word of God (preaching and teaching), and the service of charity.

### **New Procedure for Second Collections**

In order to expedite second collections at weekend Masses, from now on a distinction will be made between "special" and "second" collections. Special collections will designate national or diocesan ones, and will be taken up at the normal time, during the Preparation of the Gifts (Offertory). Those using envelopes can deposit the special envelopes in the collection basket, along with the normal Offertory contribution; those who use cash and would like to contribute to the special collection can simply use a visitor envelope and write "Special Collection" on the outside. The worship aid will include information about how to make a contribution electronically.

Second Collections which are usually cathedral-specific (e.g. Preservation, Cathedral Foundation, Catholic Campus Ministry, Haiti and Christian Formation), will be taken up during the announcements, which follow the Prayer After Communion.
