Ordinary Time

The Christmas season concludes with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Following Christmas, Ordinary Time begins. The term "Ordinary Time" translates the Latin phrase tempus per annum: literally, "time through the year." The English word "ordinary" in this sense means "ordinal," which designates a "specified order or rank in a series."

Ordinary Time designates the period of the liturgical year that is not tied to a particular feast or preparation for a feast (Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter). The Church explains that, "Apart from those seasons having their own distinctive character, thirty-three or thirty-four weeks remain in the yearly cycle that do not celebrate a specific aspect of the mystery of Christ. Rather, especially on the Sundays, they are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period is known as Ordinary Time" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and Calendar, no. 43).



Collecting Palms

Palms that were blessed last year on Palm Sunday are now being collected in preparation for the beginning of Lent. After the palms are burnt, the ashes imposed on the forehead on Ash Wednesday (February 17). Please deposit the palms in the baskets that have been placed at the entrance to the church.

The connection between Palm Sunday and Ash Wednesday highlights an important truth: We undertake penance knowing that Christ has already conquered sin by his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. The Lord's victory is meant to be ours as well. The palm is a symbol of Christ's victory, as we read in the Book of Revelation: "After this I had a vision of a great multitude, which no one could count, from every nation, race, people, and tongue. They stood before the throne and before the Lamb, wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice: 'Salvation comes from our God, who is seated on the throne, and from the Lamb.'" (7:9–10).

Presentation of the Lord Tuesday, February 2 | 6:00 p.m.

A Mass for the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord will be celebrated on Tuesday, February 2 at 6:00 p.m. (This will take the place of the normal 12:05 p.m. daily Mass.)

The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord marks the fortieth day after Christmas, and commemorates Christ's dedication in the Jerusalem temple (Luke 2:22–38). In England, the Presentation came to be known as "Candlemas," since it is the Church's custom to bless candles that will be used throughout the year (the paschal candle, candles for the Advent wreath, votive candles, candles and for the tabernacle and side altars). Parishioners are invited to bring with them candles to be blessed that will be used in their home during 2021.

Maintenance Technician Needed

The Cathedral of the Sacred Heart is looking for a full-time (40 hours/week) maintenance worker.

Duties include cleaning and sanitizing the church and office area, assisting the Director of Facilities and staff members as needed, and performing scheduled preventative maintenance and general repairs when needed.

Physical requirements include the ability to lift 50 lbs., the ability to work flexible hours, to walk extensively throughout the workday, and to climb ladders and navigate heights such as the roof areas. This position requires a successful clearance by Social Services, criminal background check, and certificate of VIRTUS training, all of which are provided through the parish. Salary is based on diocesan scale and demonstrated experience in the maintenance field.
