

ABOUT OUR PARISH

The Cathedral Parish of St. Raphael was formed on July 1, 2008 by the merger of three historic parishes located within a few blocks of the Capitol Square.

The buildings of two of those historic parishes – Holy Redeemer and St. Patrick – provide the current facilities for the Cathedral Parish. Mass is offered every day in both churches. The parish rectory is at the Holy Redeemer site, while the offices are at the St. Patrick location.

Old St. Raphael Cathedral was destroyed by arson in 2005. Bishop Morlino has announced his intention to erect a new cathedral on the same site (at West Main and Fairchild). In the meantime, an outdoor Way of the Cross is located there.



First Reconciliation & First Communion

All Religious Education and home-schooled students wishing to receive the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion are required to take special preparation classes. These classes are obligatory and supplement the regular Religious Education classes.

The First Reconciliation special preparation classes will be held Mondays, February 27th, March 6th, and March 13th, from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm in the Religious Education Center. The date of First Reconciliation is March 18th.

The special preparation classes for First Holy Communion are scheduled for Mondays, March 20th, March 27th, and April 3rd, from 6:30 pm to 8:30 pm in the Religious Education Center. First Communion rehearsal will be Saturday, April 22nd, and First Communion is set for Sunday, April 23rd, the Feast of Divine Mercy.

••• FROM THE RECTOR •••

Dear Friends in Christ:

From the time I was a boy, I realized that there are many mysteries in our religion!

Among those mysteries were the very strange names of the Sundays that came around this time of year – Septuagesima (*sep-tu-ah-jay-see-ma*), Sextagesima (*sex-ta-jay-see-ma*), and Quinquagesima (*queen-quay-jay-see-ma*). (Mom's missal did not have the phonetic spellings, so how to pronounce these strange words was yet another mystery!)

Those names disappeared from Catholic life with the reform of the calendar in 1969 . . . I don't think I had really figured out what they were about before they disappeared. But I've since learned what these words meant and I think of them today because, by the old reckoning, today would have been Septuagesima.

Septuagesima is the Latin word for seventieth (70th). It's the feminine form, since the unstated noun to which it refers is "day," a feminine word in Latin. Sextagesima means 60th; and quinquagesima, 50th.

Those were the names, in that order, of the three Sundays just before Lent. Quinquagesima was exactly 50 days before Easter. The math got a little fuzzy for the other two, but they were more-or-less sixty and seventy days out from Easter.

In the old calendar, those Sundays were a warm-up, if you will, for Lent. From Septuagesima, purple vestments were worn for Mass, and the Gloria and Alleluia were omitted. It wasn't really Lent yet . . . I don't remember giving up anything starting on Septuagesima . . . but we were given fair warning that Lent was coming.

Why do I think of all this today? Well, for one thing, it's a slow news week and there is not much else I need to write about! But there's another reason as well. I often feel – and maybe you do too – that Lent sneaks up on me. I want to make a good Lent . . . to make it a good time of spiritual growth . . . but Ash Wednesday comes before I've given too much thought to just how I am going to do that.

The three classic practices of Lent are prayer, fasting and almsgiving (charity). We are invited to do these three things in order to bring ourselves into a better relationship with God (through prayer), with ourselves (through the self-denial of fasting or some other sacrifice) and with others (through works of charity). That's just about the whole program for the Christian Life, isn't it? To be in a right relationship with God, myself and others.

Let's start today to make a concrete plan as to how we are going to practice prayer, fasting and almsgiving this Lent, and resolve to make this Lent the most fruitful one we have ever had.

"Una Luz en la noche"

EUCARISTÍA: Ministro Extraordinario de La Santísima Comunión: El Ministerio Extraordinario de Comunión envuelve a los ministros quienes asisten en distribuir la Sagrada Comunión durante la Liturgia de los Domingos y Días Festivos de la Iglesia, Misa Especiales. Su ministerio no es solamente el ser asistente oficial del clero sino que es una manera especial de ejercer la vocación sacerdotal que recibimos en el bautismo. "Es como en un cuerpo: tenemos muchos miembros, no todos con la misma función; así aunque somos muchos, formamos con Cristo un solo cuerpo y estamos unidos unos a otros como parte de un mismo cuerpo" (Rom 12:4-5)

Los Ministros Extraordinarios de la Santa Eucaristía tienen que hacer un compromiso de su tiempo.
