ABOUT OUR PARISH

The Cathedral Parish of St. Raphael was formed on July 1, 2008 by the merger of three historic parishes located within a few blocks of the Capitol Square.

The buildings of two of those historic parishes – Holy Redeemer and St. Patrick – provide the current facilities for the Cathedral Parish. Mass is offered every day in both churches. The parish rectory is at the Holy Redeemer site, while the offices are at the St. Patrick location.

Old St. Raphael Cathedral was destroyed by arson in 2005. Bishop Morlino has announced his intention to erect a new cathedral on the same site (at West Main and Fairchild). In the meantime, an outdoor Way of the Cross is located there.

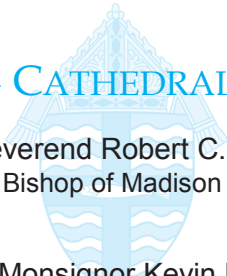

St. Vincent de Paul Society – Parish Conference

Report on charitable works during 2016

The Cathedral Parish St. Vincent de Paul Conference visits the homes of those in need (especially in the isthmus) to arrange help with furniture, housewares, and clothing vouchers from the SVdP Service Center and Stores, assistance with rent, utilities, gift cards for food and gas, and bus passes. We also provide information on the SVdP Food Pantry and other food pantries, Little Drummer, and other SVdP Society services, and referrals to agencies in Dane County and Porchlight for help with housing.

Every other month we cook and serve the meal at the Men's Shelter at Grace Episcopal Church on the Capitol Square for 75 to 125 homeless men. Conference members also attend the Training for Members offered throughout the year at the SVdP Service Center, including home visit training.

The SVdP Conference is able to help many people in need through the generous donations of parishioners in the quarterly special offering for SVdP in the collections at Mass, and other private donations. The parish contributions average from \$1,000 to \$1,300 each quarter. We use these funds to help people in need throughout the year.

A summary of the assistance provided in 2016 through 45 home visits is as follows:

- rent for 17 families/individuals (average amount of about \$200)
- utilities for 3 families/individuals
- furniture and delivery for 12 families/individuals
- gas cards and bus passes for 3 families/individuals
- gift cards for groceries for 3 families
- two unique needs: a used electric wheelchair, and new car battery

We just finished the annual Recycle the Warmth Blanket Drive. We are also planning a gift card drive for later in the year. We usually meet on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month at St. Patrick's, and meeting times are listed in the bulletin. ◆◆ FROM THE RECTOR ◆◆

Dear Friends in Christ:

A week ago Thursday, our Parish Pastoral Council held its quarterly meeting.

The Pastoral Council has identified two priorities for this year: (1) providing social opportunities for adults in order to build up the community of the parish, and (2) helping parishioners to grow in their prayer life. In this column, I'd like to share some of our discussion on the second priority: prayer.

One initiative to provide formation in prayer is already underway. This is a small group study called *Oremus* ("Let us pray" in Latin), published by Ascension Press. The study group met for the first time on the evening prior to the Pastoral Council meeting, and attracted 19 participants. A very good showing!

During the eight sessions of the *Oremus* program, participants are encouraged to become aware of the presence of God in their daily lives, and taught methods of prayer with which we can respond to Him. After each session, people are challenged to use the method they have learned during the following week.

The second prayer initiative is in preparation. Next month a number of our parishioners (some English-speaking and some Spanish-speaking) will be participating in a training-retreat for the *Lord, Teach Me to Pray* program, offered in two sessions at the Bishop O'Connor Center.

Those who participate in this training-retreat will be equipped to form ongoing prayer groups in which the participants pray with Sacred Scripture, and then come together weekly for 12 weeks to share the fruit of their prayer. Those groups are single gender - all women or all men.

One of our parishioners, Kathryn Curio, a member of the Pastoral Council, has already participated in this program and enthusiastically recommended it to the Pastoral Council.

For now, I would like to invite you to consider taking part in the training-retreat and to learn more about *Lord, Teach Me to Pray*. There is no cost, and attending certainly does not commit one to facilitating a future group.

The two sessions, each 7:00-9:00 p.m., will be held on March 7th and March 14th. If you might be interested, I invite you to contact Deacon Ray Lukesic for more information (through the parish office at 257-5000 or at deacon@).

The schedule (start date, meeting day and time) for each of the prayer groups formed will be set by the facilitators, in consultation with those interested in participating. As we have facilitators ready to begin groups, you will see invitations to participate in the groups.

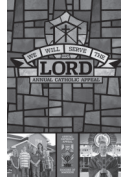

◆◆ PARA REFLEXIONAR ◆◆

“El Amor es Entrega y Donación”

La Eucaristía es el gesto de Amor mas grande. Es el gesto de Amor mas sublime que nos dejó Jesús aquí en la tierra. A la Eucaristía se le llama “El Sacramento del Amor” por excelencia. ¿Qué le movió a quedarse con nosotros? ¿Qué le movió a darnos su Cuerpo? ¿A dejar el Cielo, tranquilo y limpio, y bajar a la tierra, que es un valle de lagrimas y sufrimientos sin fin? ¿A dejar el calor de su Padre Celestial y venir a esta tierra tibia, y experimentar la soledad en tantos Sagrarios? ¿A despojarse de sus privilegios divinos y dejarlos a un lado para revestirse de ropaje humilde, sencillo, pobre, como es el ropaje del pan y vino?.



¿Qué modelos humanos nos sirven para explicar el misterio de la Eucaristía como gesto de Amor?. Veamos el ejemplo de una madre: Primero, alimenta a su hijo en su vientre, con su sangre, durante esos nueve meses de embarazo. Luego, ya nacido, le da el pecho. ¿Han visto ustedes algo mas conmovedor, mas tierno, mas amoroso que una madre amamantando a su hijo, dándole su misma vida, su mismo ser?. Así como una madre alimenta a su propio hijo con su misma vida, de su mismo cuerpo y con su misma sangre, así también Dios nos alimenta con el Cuerpo y la Sangre de su mismo Hijo Jesucristo, para que tengamos vida de Dios, y la tengamos en abundancia. Y al igual que esa madre no se ahorra nada al amamantar a su hijo, así también Dios no se ahorra nada y nos da todo: Cuerpo, Alma, Sangre y Divinidad de su Hijo en la Eucaristía.

¡El Amor es entrega y donación! Y en la Eucaristía, Dios se entrega y se dona completamente a nosotros. ¡Cuántos gestos de amor nos demuestra Cristo en la Eucaristía! Fuimos invitados al banquete: Vengan, esta todo preparado. El Rey ha mandado matar el mejor cordero que tenía. Vengan y entren. Cuando a uno lo invitan a una boda, a una fiesta, a un banquete, es por un gesto de amor. Ya en el banquete, formamos una comunidad, una familia, donde reina un clima de cordialidad, de acogida. No estamos aislados, ni en compartimientos aislados. Nos vemos, nos saludamos, nos deseamos la paz. ¡Es el gesto del amor fraterno!

El gesto de limpiarnos y purificarnos antes de comenzar el banquete, con el acto penitencial: **Yo confieso**, pone de manifiesto que el Señor lava nuestra alma y nuestro corazón, como a los suyos les lavo los pies. ¡Que amor tan delicado!. Después, en la liturgia de la Palabra, Dios nos explica su Palabra. Se da su tiempo de charla amena, seria, provechosa y enriquecedora. ¡Que amor tan atento!. Mas tarde, en el momento de la presentación de las ofrendas, Dios nos acepta lo que hemos traído al banquete: El pan, el vino y el agua. El resto lo pone El. ¡Que amor tan generoso!. Nos introduce a la intimidad de la consagración, donde se realiza la suprema locura de amor: Manda su Espíritu para transformar ese pan y ese vino en el Cuerpo y Sangre de su Hijo. Y se queda ahí para nosotros Real y Sacramentalmente, bajo las especies del pan y del vino. ¡Que amor omnipotente, que amor tan humilde!

Características de los Ministros de LECTORES: Leer en misa es un honor, no un derecho

Es evidente que el ministerio del lector implica una vida pública conforme a los mandamientos de Dios y las leyes de la Iglesia.

El lector, debe con alegría proclamar la Palabra de Dios durante la Misa como representación del pueblo de Dios y brindándoles la Palabra de Dios a sus vidas durante la liturgia.

Los lectores tienen que ser Católicos practicantes, en plena comunión con la Iglesia y tener la habilidad de leer y proclamar las escrituras con compromiso de dos a tres veces al mes.

MONITOR: Usted es **"PROCLAMADOR DE LA PALABRA DE DIOS"** durante la celebración más importante del culto de la Iglesia: La Santa Misa. Por tanto su participación debe hacerse como quien ejerce un MINISTERIO, no solamente una actuación. **De ahí la dignidad, decoro e idoneidad íntegra de la persona que "sirve" en el altar.** *Les recordamos que no están sirviendo a los hombres sino al Señor.*

El Monitor, debe de tener las siguiente características: **Cualidades humanas:** Capacidad de animar, que sensibilice lo que está diciendo de manera equilibrada y de excelente presentación física (bien vestido).

Cualidades técnicas: Arte de tomar el micrófono, saber cómo estar de pie, que sepa modular la voz.

Cualidades espirituales: Persona que sea enamorada de la Eucaristía, de vida orante capaz de transmitir esa presencia de Dios a los demás y que esté en proceso de conversión (testimonio de vida). El monitor debe tener la disposición de servir de dos a tres veces al mes.

SALMISTA: El varón o la mujer que canta las estrofas del salmo responsorial para que el pueblo responda con el estribillo. El Salmista tienen que ser Católico practicante, en plena comunión con la Iglesia y tener la disposición de servir de dos a tres veces al mes.
