

We are the Parish of the Holy Eucharist, a Catholic Community called to discipleship, seeking deeper communion with God, each other, and our neighbors by celebrating the Sacraments, sharing God's word, and serving all in need.

Dear Parishioners.

I want to thank you for giving your attention last week to the lay people who spoke to you about their love for the parish and their request to support the many activities we do here. It is my hope that Fr. Kaseta, Fr. Marquis and I will also be able to address the increase giving program this week with the same kind of enthusiasm as they did. As I have said many times, it is not my favorite thing to ask you to consider what you give weekly to your parish, but I believe in all that we do here in the parish and most importantly, I believe in the dedicated and devoted people who work and volunteer in order to know Jesus Christ in our midst. The Eucharist is the center of our life and without it, we do not believe that we would be the Church.

I know that these are difficult and frustrating times in the Church today with scandal, but I am confident that there is significant pressure on those in charge to make the necessary changes to restore the integrity we are called to have. The bishops have said that they are working on four areas:

- The bishops want to establish a third-party reporting system relative to bishops.
- The bishops want to develop proposals that will be restrictions on bishops who have been removed or resign.
- ◆ The bishops have initiated a process of developing a Code of Ethics for bishops.
- ◆ The bishops support a full investigation into the situation surrounding Archbishop McCarrick. Such investigation should rely on lay experts.

I want to thank those who came to the listening session at Sacred Heart last Sunday. It was so important to hear your thoughts and feelings over what is going on and how it is being addressed. I can fully understand the reactions of some people as they decide to stay away. I just ask you to speak with Fr. Kaseta, Fr. Marquis or me so that we can offer any kind of assistance in working through these issues. Please consider joining us for another listening session on Wednesday, October 10 at Holy Martyrs from 6:30-8:00 pm.

Moreover, while they work this out on the national and international level, we still gather around the Holy altar of God and receive the Sacred Body and Blood of Christ and the grace to know his love for us. That is the truth that does not change, even as we need to root out the evil that tries to destroy this gift from God. And, it does not take away the beautiful and faithful people who belong to this parish of which I love to be a part. Let us pray that those in authority get it right!

Dear Parishioners,

I am now in my seventh year as your pastor here at Parish of the Holy Eucharist, and it continues to be a wonderful experience of a faith community with God as the center. We have been growing together as one parish with four worship sites by offering parish adult formation projects, ministries, and devotionals. It is so exciting to see parishioners respond to the many efforts that have been offered by the ministerial team, and it is wonderful to be in the midst of talented people who offer their expertise to the parish. Most priests would love to have the remarkable and committed volunteers we have here in the parish.

As part of a diocesan effort, a team of volunteers gathered together over the past year to develop goals and strategies for pastoral planning. After filling out the parish survey and spending the summer with experts from the Catholic Leadership Institute, we have come up with three priorities and goals to respond to the new realities we face in the church. From those who participated in the process, we heard clearly that we:

are looking for more opportunities to understand our faith and make it meaningful for today by fostering a Catholic culture

want experiences of sharing faith and community

desire meaningful Sunday Mass experience

As you may know, we have a Parish Council and a Finance Council, and they have made considerable progress in mapping out a plan for the coming years. Our immediate focus is to examine our budgetary needs and the present condition of our facilities. **To accomplish these tasks in our faith, we have**

come to see that we need your help.

With the oversight of the Parish Finance Council, we will continue to operate with fiscal responsibility and constraint. However, beyond the financial figures is the reality of all that takes place. We have many ministries that serve our people such as the Marriage, Baptism, First Penance, and First Eucharist Catechetical Programs, Adult and Youth Faith Formation, and Adoration, only to mention a few. These ministries serve, with care, the spiritual needs of our people. As we look to the future, we see the need to expand the staff to include a full-time music director and a small group faith-sharing coordinator. Moreover, the parish faces increased salary and benefits costs to maintain our current employees, who are our greatest assets. Our staff already make significant sacrifices to serve the Lord by serving us. I believe it is just to care for our employees. In addition, the finance committee is concerned with finding the funds to keep up with the regular maintenance of the churches and buildings. I write this letter requesting that you consider reviewing your current giving by ask yourself if it is possible to increase your weekly offertory to the parish.

During my time here, I have never asked you to examine your weekly donations. I realize that some people do not appreciate this request because it is considered a private matter, but I also know that others may have not thought about or prayerfully reflected on what they currently give to support the parish. Not unlike your own homes, we have been experiencing rising costs to operate our parish. We have seen our energy costs go up, general maintenance costs rise and, as I mentioned above, we have seen significant jumps in costs to employ our staff, including health benefits. We need to ask you to prayerfully reflect on what you give to support our work. The tradition in the Bible has always been 10% of one's income is due to God, but a rule for me personally when I give to the parish is to I ask myself what I could buy with this contribution? Does my contribution truly reflect my means and is it in proportion to the many blessings that God has given me?

Our goal is to meet the needs for today and for your children and grandchildren in the future. We are also in the process of discussing our buildings and structures knowing that we will need to do a capital campaign in the future. Please review the suggested guidelines for giving and consider an increase in your weekly contribution, if possible. Please think of your gift as an annual one that is paid weekly. We are asking everyone to make their commitments by October 7.

I appreciate everyone's generosity to the parish and take seriously the charge to use wisely the gifts that have been entrusted to me to be used responsibly. I am sure you know that these are difficult times in the Church with the sex abuse scandal. Know that the offertory is about supporting your parish and our great people and ministries. I thank you in advance for your support, understanding and kindness.




KEEPING OUR FOCUS ON THE "GOAL"

As I reflect on the "Increased Offertory Program" that our parish is undertaking as part of the Diocesan initiative, it reminds me that I need to keep my focus on the goal...what the Parish Survey and its subsequent Goals and Objectives revealed and which we, as a parish, are implementing through our mission statement as follows: "...seeking deeper communion with God, each other, and our neighbor..."

As an earlier bulletin stated (July1, 2018) through the use of this pie chart over 68% of our parishioners state: "they practice their faith and/or are growing as a disciple".



In the survey we also discovered that 39% of you strongly feel that our parish helps you grow spiritually, as shown in this chart. We want to see that number grow so that the <u>majority</u> of parishioners feel strongly that the parish feeds them spiritually.



The "Increased Offertory Program" is one way that I feel personally challenged to increase my trust in God, who has been very generous to me and my family, to think prayerfully, purposefully, and then give a proportionate response; giving back to God in thanksgiving for all God has given me.

We identified three Priorities and subsequent Goals in the survey process:

- 1. Foster a Catholic culture to discover and weave the rich traditions of our faith into our lives.
- 2. Engage parishioners to share their faith and participate in parish life.
- 3. Revive our liturgical awareness and practice so that we might have full, conscious and active participation at Mass.

In order to implement these goals, we all should take the time to reassess where our priorities are. Are we sharing our time, talent, and especially our "treasure" in proportion to what God has given to us to take care of, as good stewards?

May God Bless you abundantly for responding to this opportunity.

The Value of the Diocesan Assessment: Parishes Sharing and Supporting Each Other

Father Greenleaf recently shared a little information about how the Diocesan assessment is used. Some people wonder why part of their offertory going to the Diocese, so I wanted to offer a little extra information about how this assessment helps support all the parishes and people in our diocese.

Of the 12.75% of our offertory that goes to the Diocese, 6.75% goes directly to our parish priests as salaries, health care, and pensions. This support offsets the costs of the priests for every parish, allowing many less fortunate parishes throughout the state to have a priest.

The remaining 6% goes to much needed Diocesan services—the vital support system that our priests and staff rely on to do our work and minister to the parish. We receive help and support with training, facilities issues, HR needs, faith formation programs, insurance questions, safe environment program, legal issues, etc. Without those services, each parish would need to pay for specialists or consultants in all these fields. Also included in these services are the information systems that are used by our parish and the faithful throughout the Diocese. The value of what we get in return for sharing our offertory comes back to us in countless, essential ways.
