When Does Easter begin? With the celebration of the Easter Vigil Mass. (Live streamed Saturday at 8:15 pm at **seasfw.org**)


Rice Bowls: a Lenten Discipline

Though the Holy See has granted to bishops the faculty to postpone the Chrism Mass to a later date. I

have decided to still celebrate it during Holy Week. The Chrism Mass will be live-streamed on Holy Thursday at 10:00 am from the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception. I decided not to delay the Chrism Mass for two reasons: we have run very low on the Sacred Chrism and it would be difficult to celebrate at a later date that we cannot yet determine. I also think we will all be very busy after the lifting of the suspension of Masses with celebrating delayed baptisms, weddings, etc. I will also be celebrating many delayed Confirmations.

There will be a diocesan-wide Stations of the Cross which I will lead live-streamed on Friday, April 3 at 7:00 pm. I encourage you to join in this great prayer which our diocese will offer up to the Lord for an end to the coronavirus epidemic, relief for those who are afflicted and eternal salvation for those whom the Lord has called to him. Let us continue to pray for one another and for an end to this pandemic. Thank you and may the Lord Bless you and your families.


Something New For Our Parishioners
