Guatemala Mission News: Dr. Jose Miguel, Director of the medical clinics, reported on May 1st that there were 30-40 new COVID-19 cases in Guatemala each day (a total of 703 on May 3rd), although only a few had been identified in Santa Lucía, Nahualá and Ixtahuacán. He stated that there are probably many more cases since they do not have enough tests for the virus. The medical clinics are open in the morning but fewer people are coming for treatment because they are afraid to leave their homes.

At the clinics, the medical staff are taking safety measures, allowing only one person to enter at a time, wearing face masks, and educating people about the virus. The clinics may need to close temporarily if the situation gets worse and if there are insufficient supplies to protect the health promoters working at the clinics. Dr. Jose Miguel has purchased more protective equipment such as face masks, hand sanitizer, and gloves, and medicines; however, the prices are much higher than normal and there is a shortage of supplies. For example, N95 masks were unavailable and the surgical face masks he was able to purchase cost eight times what they did before the pandemic. By the beginning of May, non-budgeted coronavirus-related expenses totaled \$2000.



Pastor's Column

Love Our Enemies...Including Demons???

The Lord commands us to love our enemies, to pray for those who hate us and persecute us (Mt 5:44). Well, it seems that Satan and his minions are our *worst* enemies. Are we, therefore, to love them, too, and pray for them as well?

As for loving Satan and demons, we remember what true love is: willing the good of the other for the sake of the other. Now, the *highest* good of the other is salvation: eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven with God, the angels, and the saints forever. Perhaps there is not much harm in loving Satan and demons with that aim and end in mind, but to do so would be the very epitome of wishful thinking and truly a waste of time and effort. Why is that? Because there is no hope for salvation for them. Why? Because we remember that Satan and the demons originally were angels but now are *fallen* angels. Angels, being pure spirit, were endowed from the very beginning with perfect knowledge and the fullness of free will. Which means that, in the case of Satan and the demons, if they should freely choose to rebel against God's will, they had full knowledge of what that would entail: fall from grace, expulsion from Heaven (where God *is*), because they rejected God and so decided that they would rather be where God is *not* (in other words: hell).

And so, if to love is to will the good of the other for the sake of the other, and if the highest good is eternal life in Heaven, and if Satan and demons have already irrevocably made their choice to *not* be in Heaven...then loving them has no point and serves no purpose. And we, who are so mortal and weak, should strive to have our limited lives much better spent on loving those who in some way can still benefit from the fruits of our love for them.

As for praying for Satan and the demons: again, waste of time. Praying for somebody has its aim and end ultimately at their salvation. And so, like trying to love Satan and the demons, it is truly a colossal waste of our time and effort to pray for them when prayer simply will have no effect.

Now, all of this is not to say that God is without mercy. God is all-loving, all-merciful, and undoubtedly would receive all hellbound creatures of His Creation if He could...but again, by their perfect knowledge and fullness of free will, Satan and the demons made their choice, and they will never do anything to undo the choice they made. They damned themselves forever by making the free choice in their perfect understanding to reject God.

The famous American exorcist, Fr. Gary Thomas, teaches this. And in the end, he counsels that with regard to Satan and the demons, we just leave them for Jesus alone to take care of, and we focus our time and efforts instead on where our love and prayers actually can have an impact: peace in our world, the salvation of souls in Purgatory and here on Earth, and above all else the glory of God's majesty.



Inspiration for the week

What do you imagine the resurrected life of heaven to be like? When we try to get our minds around such an enormous concept, we can easily find ourselves at a loss. For some folks, the enormity of the question actually causes them to ignore the reality of heaven or even conclude that it does not exist. Jesus knew that the magnitude and grandeur of eternal life are really too much for us to grasp. He kept it simple and described it in terms of relationship. The disciples treasured their relationship with Jesus, and he assured them, "Where I am you also may be." Ultimately, that was enough for them to know. They would be with him. Strengthen your relationship with God as He is the way, the truth, and the life. Is the assurance that you will be with Him enough for you as well?


GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When earthly lives end, especially when the person is younger, we tend to focus upon and consider what was lost. We think of lost opportunities — things they won't be able to see, babies they won't be able to cradle, and adventures that now must go undiscovered. Our minds create this chasm between earth and heaven that sees the losses of this life as permanent ones, never possible to achieve again. This perception causes many folks to remain stuck in their grief as they ponder all of the missed opportunities and regrets.

This is not resurrection thinking. All of the love that we can give and receive, the joy and elation that can be experienced, the adventures that can be undertaken, and the possibilities to be discovered are all part of a continuous journey. They are not ends in and of themselves but are all part of the unfolding of a relationship we have with God, who not only makes all of these wonderful things possible now but sustains them and fulfills them into eternity. The perception and experience of loss is really an illusion, because in God's eternal kingdom and in God's time, nothing is ever lost. Even the most intimate and tender of moments we can conceive of sharing with another human being are only part of a journey toward perfect intimate and tender moments to be shared with God in our resurrected life. We become like God and see God as He is in eternity. What greater joy, love, and hope can ever be discovered as we walk down our often dimly lit paths in this world.

This is an awesome wonder and magnificent news to behold. Call to mind someone you have lost in death. How do you see them now? How do you see yourself in heaven? Remind yourself, again, that God is the Way, the Truth and the Life. Our happiness is not going to be fully realized in this world, and there is nothing we can find here that cannot be found one hundred fold in eternity. It's all about relationship, and not solely about the relationships we have with each other, ourselves, and the world in which we live. It's about our relationship with God. If we realize how special that one relationship really is, then there is only one particular of heaven and life eternal that really matters: namely, that we fall into love eternal and discover truth. For when we finally close our eyes in death, then all will be well as long as we are with God. There are no losses, only gains.

Be with those who have fallen ill and give them Your comforting heart.


Wrap Your arms around our world and hold us in Your love.




