The Tabernacle...

The word tabernacle derives from the Latin tabernaculum (tent), and recalls the Jewish "meeting tent," which housed the Ark of the Covenant and thus embodies the presence of God among the people. In Catholic churches today, the tabernacle houses communion bread that has been consecrated at the Liturgy/the Holy Mass. The practice of reserving the Eucharist dates back in some places to the earliest days. In the second century, a small amount of consecrated communion bread was placed in an ambry or a pyx, often shaped like a casket or a dove. This vessel was small enough to be carried to the homes of those who were unable to attend the community's Eucharist. This was the only reason for reservation. Devotion to the reserved Eucharist grew during the Middle Ages when the reception of communion declined. By the sixteenth century, the custom of a fixed container for the reserved Eucharist – the tabernacle as part of the main altar – was in place; in 1614 it became prescribed practice for most places.

The normative guidelines of the Church today indicate that the tabernacle be placed elsewhere than on an altar, and never on the altar used for the Liturgy/the Mass. An appropriate setting would be on a pillar, in a wall niche or possibly, in a chapel set apart from the main assembly area. Such a setting should also provide for the private devotion of the faithful. The tabernacle in its modern setting still recalls the ancient image of a house for the divine presence, and reminds the assembly of those in the parish who are confined to their households, waiting for the ministry of those who have celebrated the Eucharist.

The tabernacle is made of noble materials, giving it a quiet dignity as the symbol of an ever-present God and the real and continual presence of Christ in the Church. A lamp burns nearby in silent witness of this mystery.

The tabernacle at St. Peter is not original to the church. I have no idea where the original tabernacle is. The present tabernacle gracing our sanctuary has been in St. Peter Church since the 1980's but was not located at the altar or in the sanctuary or, in fact, in the nave of the church. Its original location was in the original baptistry for the present church. Let me explain some local St. Peter history.

In the 1980's the original baptismal font and baptistry area, because of their obscure and distant location from the assembly, were no longer used for baptisms in our church. Beginning in the 80's, baptisms at St. Peter took place in the low ceiling area on the left side of the church near the choir area where the daily Mass chapel was located.

Brother Mel Meyer was commissioned by our parish to create a baptismal bowl out of copper for our baptismal font. He hand crafted the baptismal bowl and the table that the copper bowl would rest on. The copper baptismal bowl was used approximately from 1980 to 2003 for all the baptisms at St. Peter. Upon completion of the remodeling of our church in 2003, the original baptismal font located in the original baptistry (the little round room near the gathering space and now the Chapel of the Archdiocesan Patrons) was transferred to the nave of the church near the new gathering space at the entrance to the church and is now our baptismal font once again along with the baptismal pool at the foot of the font.

The Brother Mel Meyer copper baptismal bowl is now on the credenza in the Gathering Space and graces that space as a local work of art and a blest sacramental of history.

So what about our present tabernacle? Since the original baptistry and font were no longer used in the 1980's a wood plate was placed on the old font and our present tabernacle was placed upon it and that space became a mini-Eucharistic Chapel. The doors to the inside of the church were locked and closed during the day and folks could use the outside west doors of the church to gain entrance to that mini-Eucharistic chapel for Eucharistic devotion.

Upon completion of the remodeling of our church in 2003 that tabernacle was then restored and transferred to our newly remodeled sanctuary where it remains to this day. The mini-Eucharistic chapel and former baptistry then became our Chapel of the Archdiocesan Patron Saints and contains the statue of Saint Louis, the King and pictures of Ste. Philippine Duchesne and St. Vincent DePaul.

The present tabernacle is made of brass and contains in large letters on its doors the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet: Alpha and Omega. Those letters traditionally symbolize that Jesus is the beginning and the end of all things. Also contained on the doors of our tabernacle are the symbols of wheat and grapes symbolizing the elements of the Holy Eucharist. Our tabernacle was donated by Mr. and Mrs. J. Mathis.

Hey, it's October, arguably one of the best months in Missouri! Enjoy its sights, colors and smells. Take care and be safe and healthy and I'll see you in church live or livestream!

Please Support this Weekend's Diaconate Formation Fund by using the envelope found in your contribution packet or by donating online through our website. These funds help relieve some of their financial burdens for studies to become a deacon.

Since 1977, 487 men have been ordained as permanent deacons in the Archdiocese. There are 211 active deacons ordained for the Archdiocese and 102 retired deacons. There are 44 men in formation at this time.

When the permanent diaconate program was initiated in the Archdiocese in January 1977, men went through a two-year formation program, with a third year of post-ordination formation. Since then, the program has gradually ex-

panded to five years of formation, plus three more years of post-ordination formation.

Deacons serve in parishes, hospitals, archdiocesan agencies, and other organizations. They offer their time, talent and energy to strengthen our church in St. Louis and do not receive compensation for their work. Their service extends into many areas of parish life, including the proclamation of the Gospel, liturgical functions, administration, and charitable works. Many active deacons continue to be employed full-time, requiring them to balance family lives and professions with their ministry as a deacon.



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained: The Tradition of Genuflection

Question:

Why do Parishes Offer Special Masses like Thanksgiving and Memorial Day, even though they're not Holy Days of Obligation? Am I obligated to attend?

Answer:

Out of respect for the various civil celebrations that take place during the year, many dioceses and parishes will host special Masses. However, while it always worthwhile to come together to worship as a community, Catholics are not obligated to attend these celebrations. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church notes, the only times that we are obligated to participate in celebrations of the Eucharist are on Sundays and holy days of obligation:

The first precept ("You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor") requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.


Helping our Neighbors in Need

This Ministry reaches out to members of our parish family who are ill, in nursing homes, having surgery, or in need of comfort in any way by providing them with a prayer shawl




