

Whose House is this?

Whose house is the Church building, God or ours?

The answer is yes! Both! Our church is God's house because it is the house of the Body of Christ, the Church. We cannot contain God. We cannot imprison God is some structure made of human hands. But when we who made holy by baptism, confirmation, and eucharist gather together, then God chooses to live here in this place, among us. When we who are God's Church gather together, with our bishop (or his delegate, the priest) and the deacon, around our book (on its ambo stand), at our font (and its water), and especially around the Lord's altar (which is a dining table set in the shadow of the cross), God choses to dwell here, too.

The God who wove the night time sky and buttoned it with stars, the God for whom the Rocky Mountains are naught but a bit of mud squished between divine toes, and for whom the oceans are but puddles - - this God does not need a temple. But the people whom this God loves from before time began do need a place to gather, and to remember in sacred rites that the Church is made of flesh and blood before it is made of brick and board. Our church building is that place! So it should be simply beautiful, and we should care lovingly for it. It is not any meeting hall. It is not any old living room. It is not a museum or a classroom, either. It is a holy place, a holy land right here in our neighborhood where the body of Christ is joined, where the voice of Christ rings out, where the sacrifice of Christ is offered and shared.

It is good to show reverence in and to this building. But reverence is not ignoring one's neighbor as a distraction. Reverence is the wonder that we experience and the love that we show when we realize that each one of those here gathered around the Lord's altar is a living stone that builds a spiritual house, and it is here that God truly lives among us.

Our "House of God" was designed in 1949 by Joseph Murphy, the dean of Washington University School of Architecture. It was the second of a trilogy of churches he designed for the Archdiocese immediately following World War II. The other two were Saint Ann in Normandy and Resurrection in South Saint Louis.

Designed to truly be the barque (boat) of Peter, the fisherman, Saint Peter Church is built in the traditional basilica style with a long nave (boat) and rounded apse behind the altar. Even on the outside on the roof line where the roof meets the brick facing exists a long copper sheath with wavy lines resembling the sea. Notice it the next time you stand outside our church.

Msgr. Westhoff, the then pastor of Saint Peter Parish, had a huge hand in its design as did Francis Deck, a parishioner and liturgical artist. They wanted it to be crafted in the European mode, that is, with local artists creating it and gracing its presence with their art. Thus everything in our church was designed for our church/worship space and unique to our church. Nothing in our church is from a catalogue. You were literally going to Mass with the people who created it and crafted it. Even the stunning and unique stained glass windows, reflecting the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the old Roman Canon of the Mass, were designed by Francis Deck and crafted by the Emil Frei Art Glass Studios now just down the street in Sugar Creek Valley. The statuary and Stations of the Cross were designed and hand made by local sculptor, Rudy Torrini, of Webster Groves.

Our "House of God" was unique and still is and very much ahead of its time when it was built. Many, at the time, had a love/hate relationship with it as it did not "look like a church" in the minds of some. It certainly did not even come close in appearance to the church it replaced, the 1867 St. Peter Church, which was a very traditional gothic structure complete with a steeple and high wooden altar and filled with gothic arches. No, the "new" St. Peter Church took on a modern tone and reflected a newer American design coming of age in those post-war years in our country. Now 70 plus years old our church has reached a comfortable level of acceptability and has grown old gracefully. It is now referred to as a "mid-century modern" structure and has been categorized by the Kirkwood Landmarks Commission as a landmark church, an historic structure. Too bad Monsignor Westhoff did not live to see that!

By the way, do you know the official name of our St. Peter Church? It is officially named after St. Peter Basilica in Rome, in Vatican City, with the proper name being, *Saint Peter, the Prince of Apostles*. Just look on our church's cornerstone at the west entrance to our church and you will clearly see our church's official name. The Cornerstone reads: "In honor of Saint Peter, Prince of Apostles, this church is erected to the glory of God."

We have begun our second quarter at our school and we are grateful to our teachers and staff and students and parents for following all the covid protocols that has kept us safe and healthy. Let us continue to pray for each other through this pandemic.....and let us give it over to the Blessed Mother for her guidance and protection. Pray the rosary everyday!





Inspiration for the week

Do we really understand how important our relationships with our brothers and sisters throughout the world truly are? Many give God's commandment to love your neighbor and yourself a congenial glance of approval and agreement without really thinking about the implications. 

GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

For some reason, it is easier to genufiect in reverence to the presence of Christ in the tabernacle of a church, than to genufiect in reverence to the same presence of Christ in another person's soul. We wrongly believe that God divides himself, placing himself in one place in preference to another. It doesn't work that way. Love of God and love of neighbor are intimately and inseparably connected because the essence and spark of God's very presence is in all creation. God's presence is just as real in the one who is good, as in the one who is bad, and the one who is just, and the one who is unjust.

Our brains get in the way of truly contemplating the awesomeness of this truth. We like to separate things into boxes, the sheep from the goats and the deserving from the undeserving. But, with God there are no distinctions such as this. Our human classifications, subdivisions, and definitions hold no power or have any weight in God's eyes. Sadly, we relate to God and to each other as if they do.

We cannot be deaf to the world's pain. It is not about having, hording, accumulating, acquiring, securing, storing, protecting, owning, claiming, or any of the other human terms we use to distinguish mine from yours. We put so much power in these words and that power, even though we may not always realize it, can cause those words and the distinctions they carry to wound and hurt others. We have the whole order of things wrong, but we are so set on preserving this order that we are absolutely afraid to do it any other way. We go through hoops trying to convince ourselves why the perils of the person seeking a new place to call home are not our perils that we turn our back and justify closing our doors. It makes perfect sense to us. Yet, it makes no sense in terms of our faith. It doesn't square with any of the words found in Sacred Scripture or in any time-tested teaching of the church.

We have it all reversed. We know that we do because when Jesus speaks about such things and the words of the Old Testament prophets ring out again, we start to feel uncomfortable and anxious. What we do, directly or by omission, to one of the least of these little ones we do to God. It is quite possible that some of what we are doing personally, economically, politically, globally, and even religiously is doing more harm than good. Let's ponder that a bit.

Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labor of love.
