

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This program involves preparation for and celebration of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist for the Christian initiation of unbaptized adults, unbaptized children of catechetical age, as well as for welcoming baptized Catholics and non-Catholics into full communion with the Church. The Sacrament of Baptism

Baptisms are normally celebrated on the second and fourth Sundays of the month. Parents seeking to have a child baptized at St. Mary's should contact the rectory office to make the necessary arrangements.

The Sacrament of Matrimony

Couples seeking to be married at St. Mary's are to call the rectory to make arrangements at least six months in advance of their intended wedding date. This should be done prior to any other reception or invitation arrangements so that the parish may suitably serve the couple.

The Sacrament of Anointing

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Parishioners,

This year I've encouraged you to celebrate and practice Thanksgiving for the whole month of November. The reason we should do this is because giving thanks is the right way to respond to the Lord for all His blessings. Secondly, practicing gratitude and giving thanks makes our lives better. The truth of this is well documented in the book, The Gospel of Happiness by Christopher Kaczor. The subtitle of the book is "Rediscover Your Faith Through Spiritual Practice and Positive Psychology." The author is a professor of philosophy at Loyola University in Los Angeles. In his book, Kaczor discusses how the new field of "positive psychology" is validating the teachings of Jesus Christ in regard to attaining real happiness. Positive Psychology is a comparatively recent development in the field of psychology which focuses on what makes people happy, as opposed to the traditional preoccupation with what causes people to be unhappy and emotionally ill. The goal of it is to help people to "accentuate the positive" rather than being obsessed with the things that make them sad or depressed.

In the excerpt below Kaczor writes about the positive effects of practicing gratitude. I hope that you find it of interest as we enter into Thanksgiving week. I also hope that you and your families have a Happy Thanksgiving. I invite you to come to our 9:30 Mass that morning, so that you can begin the day by giving thanks to God.

THE WAY OF GRATITUDE

Robert Emmons, professor of psychology at the University of California, and perhaps the world expert in gratitude research, summarizes some of the chief findings in the scientific study of the practice of gratitude:

"Experiencing gratitude leads to increased feelings of connectedness, improved relationships, and even altruism. We have also found that when people experience gratitude, they feel more loving, more forgiving, and closer to God. Dozens of research studies with diverse participant groups have also revealed that the practice of gratitude leads to the following:

Increased feelings of energy, alertness, enthusiasm, and vigor; Success in achieving personal goals; Better coping with stress; A sense of closure in traumatic memories; Bolstered feelings of self-worth and self-confidence; Solidified and secure relationships; Generosity and helpfulness; Prolonging of enjoyment produced by pleasurable experiences; Improved cardiac health through increases in vagal tone; Greater sense of purpose and resilience".

The benefit of practicing gratitude toward others is now a well-established finding in psychology....

Perhaps this is why I love Thanksgiving Day, and in that I am not alone. A Gallup poll found that Americans' favorite day of the year is the fourth Thursday of November. Thanksgiving Day also has the fewest number of suicides. On Thanksgiving, people stop focusing on what they don't have and rejoice in what they do have. Gratitude literally saves lives.

Obviously, gratitude can be defined in different ways. Emmons defines it as "a willingness to recognize (a) that one has been the beneficiary of someone's kindness, (b) that the benefactor has intentionally provided a benefit, often incurring some personal cost and (c) that the benefit has value in the eyes of the beneficiary." Each element of this definition is important. Gratitude is inherently social in that it always involves a benefactor giving a benefit to a beneficiary. We are not grateful to ourselves but to another person. No one writes a thank-you note addressed, "Dear Me." In addition, in order for gratitude to exist, the giver must act intentionally, typically making some sort of selfsacrifice, to bestow something worthwhile. Finally, the one receiving the gift needs to recognize it as a gift, as something good that was freely given. Gratitude also engages at least three different aspects of the human person. We intellectually recognize the benefit, we willingly acknowledge this benefit, and we emotionally appreciate both the gift and the giver. The term "gift" is important in this context because gifts are unearned, things to which we are not entitled, things we are not owed by the giver.

Gratitude can be in any of these aspects. We can grow in frequency of gratitude when we seek to become more often aware of the good things already embedded in our lives. We can increase the intensity of gratitude by recalling that whatever benefits we receive almost always come at some cost to the provider of the benefits. We can

increase the span of gratitude when we remember the many good things that we enjoy. And we can grow in density of gratitude in becoming more aware that virtually all the benefits we enjoy involve the collaboration of many people.

Virtually all the things that we have – from food, to clothes, to electricity, to running water – have been brought to us by the work of thousands and thousands of people. Gratitude density is awareness of reality, as is for that matter gratitude intensity, span, and frequency.

God, Gifts, and Gratitude: The Christian Difference

Belief in God influences the intensity, span, frequency, and density of gratitude. If we believe in God, we have more for which to be grateful, since (we know) something as basic as our being alive is not a mere chance happening, but ultimately the result of a loving God's providential care. Recall gratitude requires a benefactor intentionally provides a benefit. Without God, our life is merely a chance accident of reproduction. In this perspective, there is no one to whom we could be grateful. If a providential God exists, however, life is a gift from above, not a pure random occurrence, but a blessing. The same point applies to other seemingly random good things in life, all of which can be seen as gifts from a loving God, for which thankfulness is appropriate.
