

Sun from Cloud...

The twelfth day of Christmas is the solemn feast of the Epiphany, January 5th. The word *epiphany* comes from the Greek and means "revelation," and so we celebrate the revelation of Christ to the magi, who were gentiles and did not belong to the people of Israel.

Learn this Appalachian folk song in honor of the star that guided the magi to the Christ child. Find out if anyone you know is familiar with it and could teach it to you. (Take the time! Or check a local music store's folk section. (If that fails, try shopping on the Internet.) The words are:

> Bright mornin' star's arisin' Bright mornin' star's arisin' Bright mornin' star's arisin' Day is breakin' in my soul.

The daily prayer of the Orthodox churches gives us these lovely verses for the solemn feast of the Epiphany:

The magi who had been led on their way by a divine star stood before you in wonder at your marvelous birth;

And bearing gifts they see the sun who rose from the virgin cloud. Let the people who sat in darkness see shining forth the light that knows no evening,

him whom the stars once manifested to the fireworshiping Persian kings.

Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever!

Bless Your Door on Epiphany...

The gospel tells us that the magi found Christ "on entering the house." The door to your home is a holy threshold. You can bless those who come in and go out by inscribing above the door in chalk the first two numbers of the year +C+M+B+ the last two numbers of the year. Thus "20+C+M+B+21" will appear on our doorways leading to the outside of the home this year. Tradition tells us that the letters stand for the names of the magi: Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar. Adolf Adam points out that it may also mean "Christus mansionem benedict" or "May Christ bless this home." It is appropriate to bless your door in January – janua means "door" and the first month is the door to the new year.

After inscribing the doorways, say this prayer:

God of Bethlehem and Cana, God of Jordan's leaping waters, in baptism you bring us into your family.

You wed us and embrace us as your beloved.

May we fill this place with kindness to one another, with hospitality to guests and with abundant care for every stranger.

By the gentle light of a star, guide home all who seek you on paths of faith, hope, and love.

Then we will join the angels in proclaiming your praise: Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever. Amen.

Then sing a Christmas Carol...like "We Three Kings".

At all the Masses today we will be blessing chalk for you. Some of the chalk will be white chalk and some will be colored chalk depending upon your needs at your home. Please take a piece of blessed chalk home with you and inscribe your doorways with the "Epiphany Blessing." In today's world we need all the blessings we can get. This is an ancient tradition and a beautiful one. Take and enjoy.



From Bethlehem to Jordan

The feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the last day of the Christmas season. At daily prayer this day, the Orthodox churches pray:

Let us assemble in spirit, O faithful, at the streams of the Jordan that we might behold a great and mighty wonder.

We shall see the Creator of all made manifest as he comes to be baptized.

Let us pass, O faithful, from Bethlehem to Jordan.

For behold, the Light which came into the darkness there begins to overcome the night.

Find out the date of your baptism. Ask a relative, or write to the parish that baptized you. Write the date on the new calendar. Celebrate the anniversary this year by participating in the eucharist. Spend some time reflecting on your Christian mission — your part in spreading God's love.

When Jesus was baptized, he came out of the water and heard a heavenly voice say, "You are my beloved; with you I am well pleased." Listen for this voice today whenever you "come out of the water" — the shower, the snow or rain, the swimming pool, the sudsy kitchen sink. Glory in heaven and peace on earth, now and forever! Alleluia! Amen!



Inspiration for the week



Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture


"Where is that thing?" mumbled Bob as he searched frantically on his dimly lit desk for the current electric bill. "I know I put it right on top of these papers this morning!" Growing in frustration and bordering on anger, he flies stuff around, moves books and opines why simple tasks need to be so hard. Enter his wife, who calmly says, "Maybe it would help if you put the light on, dear." The desk light goes on and lo and behold, there is the electric bill right where Bob left it earlier. All it took was a little light!

We stubbornly refuse to turn on the lights! Either we are distracted, determined, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Or perhaps, we fail to do the obvious. We would rather live our lives with the dimmest of lights or even in total darkness. Why are we afraid to do something so that we can actually see? It might help us to find quicker and better answers to problems, the meaning of life, relationships, happiness, and what is ultimate truth. Yet, we stumble along, moving things from one side to the other, getting angry, feeling cheated, being unsettled, resigning ourselves to the agony of defeat once again.

"And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was." The light has come into the world in the person of Jesus Christ! We no longer have to fumble in the darkness. We have been gifted with the illumination we need to see our way through things and find what we really are looking for. All these years later, however, so many are still reluctant to accept him. Perhaps they are unconvinced, disinterested, preoccupied, stubborn, apprehensive, or all of the above. Everyone has their own reason for not wanting to turn on the switch.

But there are so many answers to so many of our problems in this humble Child of Nazareth. A simple birth teaches us about God's tender wedded relationship with humanity. It speaks to the expanse of God's salvation across the globe, and the incarnate Divine wonders and blessings that are a part of our life moment to moment. It calls us to understand the design of world order God intended as found in the Beatitudes, the sacredness of every human life and all of creation and the meaning of things we struggle with most, like suffering and death. We have a lot of Good News to share, not just with a privileged few but with all the world. All races and creeds can receive God's healing word. God continues to manifest himself even now! Use the light to find what you are really looking for!





APOSTLES VS. DISCIPLES

Question: What is the difference between apostles and disciples?

Answer:

When we look at the gospel accounts of the life of Jesus, we see two special titles applied to his followers: *apostles* and *disciples*. At first glance, we might think that these two words are interchangeable, but when we look at what each one means, we quickly see that the evangelists were using them very specifically. When we look more closely, we see that while Jesus had many *disciples*, the group of *apostles* was much more limited and referred to Jesus' closest collaborators.

The word *apostle* essentially means "one who is sent forth" or, as we might think of it today, "an ambassador." The group of apostles — sometimes called the Twelve — included those twelve men who formed Jesus' inner circle (see Mark 3:13-14; Luke 6:12-13). It was this group that received the gift of the Holy Spirit and who were sent out by Jesus with the special mission of forgiving sins on that first Easter Sunday (see John 20:19-23). In time, the Catholic Tradition also recognize Saint Paul and Saint Barnabas as apostles, recognizing that they also shared the mandate of going out in the Lord's name to pray, to bless, and to preach. In 2016, during the Jubilee of Mercy, Pope Francis raised the liturgical celebration of Saint Mary Magdalene to the rank of feast, recognizing that she also received a special mandate to proclaim the good news of Jesus' resurrection to the Eleven, becoming the "apostle to the apostles." In a particular way, the bishops continue the mission of the apostles in our own time.

When we think of the word *disciple*, we see that it has a very different meaning. Rather than referring to those who were sent out to carry on the mission of Jesus, disciple literally means "student" or, more specially, an "apprentice learner." The task of the disciple is to learn and integrate into their lives the teachings, values, and way of life of their master teacher. Although a disciple might be called on to explain or represent aspects of their life, in light of the teachings they receive from this master teacher, Christian discipleship is ultimately about living our lives with faith and integrity, guided by the life and mission of Jesus, our Master Teacher. The call to discipleship is the common vocation of all Christians.

This Ministry reaches out to members of our parish family who are ill, in nursing homes, having surgery, or in need of comfort in any way by providing them with a prayer shawl representing the prayers and support of the parish community. New
