

# BAPTISMAL PREPARATION PROGRAM

All parents must participate in a team-led preparation session if this is their first child and/or if they do not worship at Sunday Masses. Parents whose children are not yet born may participate in the program if they like. It takes place in the rectory on select Sunday afternoons from 1:00 pm to 2:30 pm. The dates for the next three sessions are Sundays: in 2022: October 9 and November 20; and in 2023 (thus far) on January 8. Please call Monsignor Sullivan (508-754-5361) to pre-register for the program. Later dates for these sessions will be posted in 2023. Actual baptisms take place on select Sundays at the 11:00 am Mass. Parents work with Msgr. Sullivan to establish an appropriate date. The next scheduled public celebrations of infant Baptism at Mass will take place on the following Sundays: in 2022 ~ November 6 and December 11. Dates for baptisms in 2023 are: January 15, February 19, April 16, May 21, and June 18.

# **Worcester Public Schools Sex Education**

How high is the risk for Sexually Transmitted Diseases? Under the Worcester Public Schools sex-ed curriculum being taught again this Fall, the answer key for 7th Grade Teachers lists "bathing together" and "mutual masturbation" as having "no risk for STDs." Anal sex and oral sex using condoms are labeled "low risk" for STDs. Please see the *Rights, Respect, Responsibility* sex-education curriculum on the publisher's website at <a href="https://www.3rs.org/3rs-curric-search">https://www.3rs.org/3rs-curric-search</a> to see what else your 12- and 13-year-old sons and daughters will be taught this year. Massachusetts law gives parents the right to opt their children out of sex-ed programs. NEW OPT-OUT FORMS MUST BE SUBMITTED EACH YEAR. Please share this information with friends and neighbors who may be unaware of the content of this program or of their rights as parents to opt their child out. Thank you.

# **NEED 'ADULT CONFIRMATION?'**

Were you baptized and received Holy Communion but never confirmed? Do you want to be able to be a godparent or a Confirmation sponsor? If any are interested, our parish has preparation sessions each year for those adults who were never confirmed. The program is for adults who were baptized and received First Holy Eucharist (Communion) but never completed their initiation into the Catholic Church through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Msgr. Sullivan conducts the 6-session program on Thursday evenings (November 10 & 17; December 1 & 15; January 12 & 19) from 7:15 to 8:15 pm. The Confirmation ceremony takes place at St. Paul's Cathedral in early February, when Bishop McManus celebrates the sacrament for adults from throughout the diocese. Hope for Housing cards are sold in the church foyer after all Masses. Here's how they work: You purchase food or gift cards in various amounts of \$10 to \$100; You use the food cards for your shopping; You receive the full-face value of the card you purchase; What you don't spend remains on your card for later use; The supermarket or store donates 5% to 10% of what you spend to prevent family homelessness. # Women's Guild's Annual Baby Bottle Drive

Once again, our Women's Guild will be conducting the Annual Baby Bottle Drive and will **distribute** special envelopes for this drive at all Masses **this weekend**. This is a benefit for Visitation House, a Catholic home for homeless pregnant women in crisis. Since opening many years ago the staff has welcomed hundreds of mothers and their babies. While women await the birth of their babies Visitation House feeds, clothes, educates and nurtures them. After the birth of their baby, mothers can stay up to six months and are assisted with housing, higher education, job opportunities and basic necessities to start their new lives. It costs well over \$3,000 per month (for each mother and baby) and the house can accommodate 12 moms and infants at a time. # **Every Life is Sacred**

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. This belief is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. In our society, the value of human life is being threatened by the harsh treatment of so many minority groups and the disabled as well as through physician assisted suicide, cloning, embryonic stem cell research, and the use of the death penalty. The intentional targeting of civilians in war or terrorist attacks is always wrong. Catholic teaching also calls on us to work to avoid war. Nations must protect the right to life by finding increasingly effective ways to prevent conflicts and resolve them by peaceful means. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

Just as the commandment "Thou shalt not kill" sets a clear limit in order to safeguard the value of human life, today we also have to say "thou shalt not" to an economy of exclusion and inequality. Such an economy kills. How can it be that it is not a news item when an elderly homeless person dies of exposure but it is news when the stock market loses two points?

The basis for all that the Church believes about the moral dimensions of economic life is its vision of the transcendent worth, the sacredness, of human beings. The dignity of the human person, realized in community with others, is the criterion against which all aspects of economic life must be measured.

There exist sinful inequalities that affect millions of men and women. These are in open contradiction of the Gospel. The equal dignity of all persons demands that we strive for fairer and more humane conditions. Excessive economic and social disparity between individuals and peoples of the one human race is a source of scandal and militates against social justice, equity, human dignity, as well as social and international peace.


