Bill Faust



William J. Faust, II-Esq. was born in Columbia, SC and moved to Philadelphia with his parents when he was thirteen. His father, a pharmacist, wanted a better living for the three of them as there were no jobs for him in SC. Bill attended Catholic schools from elementary through college. He received a scholarship from West Catholic to attend Duquesne University. After college he served as a probation officer before earning his law degree from North Carolina Central University, a public historically Black university in Durham. While in Durham, Bill met his wife, Rev. Dr. Dianne Faust, Ph.D.

They have been blessed with five children, two of whom are medical doctors.

Here at Holy Cross Parish, we know Bill through his ministry as a greeter. He also served for five years on the Parish Pastoral Council. The ministry of a greeter is characterized by the belief that growing a dynamic Catholic faith community depends on creating a sense of belonging in all those who enter our church for worship. Bill embodies that ministry with his infectious smile and a handshake. A consistent presence at the 5:00 Mass, he greets people by name, making them feel known and welcome. Bill spent fifteen years at St. Therese as a greeter before coming to Holy Cross as part of the merger. He had planned to go to another parish, but Fr. Grogan recognized his gifts and asked him to come to Holy Cross. Bill did not hesitate, and he has been a member of Holy Cross parish since 2016. Bill initially became a greeter out of a desire to be involved in the service of the church. He followed in the footsteps of his father who was a greeter for many years. Bill is also inspired by St. Paul, a model for him of an evangelizer. Bill noticed that almost every Sunday, one of the readings was from Paul, and that made him want to learn more. He read 20 books about him, started reading the Bible, and kept a prayer journal. His faith began to grow. For Bill, St. Paul is one of the most influential people in spreading Christianity, and he is filled by Paul's spirit of happiness in spreading the Word. As Bill greets people and welcomes them to our church family, he keeps in mind St. Paul's message to the Corinthians that we are many parts but one body.
