

About the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a religious formation program based on Montessori teaching principles for children from the ages of 3 to 12. It seeks to create and facilitate a sacred “hands-on” environment for children called an atrium, in which both the children and the catechist can hear, ponder and celebrate the most essential mysteries of the Christian faith as revealed in Scriptures and Liturgy.

Originally developed in Rome by Dr. Sofia Cavelletti and Gianna Gobbi over 50 years ago, the Catechesis has since spread worldwide and is used in several denominations.

Catechesis Formation

There are three levels of training for those interested in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd: Level I – for children ages 3-6; Level II – for ages 6-9; and Level III – ages 9-12. Each level involves approximately 100 hours of lectures, meditations, presentations and album page assistance. The participants who complete the course will receive certification for Level I from the National Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd.

Level I Course Objectives

- To explore with participants the general developmental and religious characteristics of the 3-6 year old child.
- To facilitate meditation on the biblical and liturgical themes of the Catechesis.
- To offer guidelines and assistance to catechists for setting up an atrium for 3-6 year olds, preparing an album, and making materials.
- To deepen participants’ ability to observe and learn from children,
- To aid formation of a community of catechists in the Saint Louis area.

The Formation Team

Ashleigh Keys has served as a catechist for 18 years and is certified in all 3 levels. She has a Master of Arts in Pastoral Studies with a concentration in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd and is recognized by the National Association of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd as a Level I Formation Leader.

Julie Kilian has served as a CGS catechist for over 20 years. She has been trained at all 3 levels and has a MA in Pastoral Studies with a concentration in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd from Aquinas Institute. She is recognized by the National Association of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd as a Level I Formation Leader.

Tuition and Texts

Tuition for this course will be \$600 plus the cost of the textbooks. Participants are asked to purchase these texts for the course: *The Religious Potential of the Child, 3rd edition*, by Sofia Cavelletti; *Nurturing the Whole Child* by Gianna Gobbi; and *The Good Shepherd & The Child: A Joyful Journey* by Patricia Coulter et al.
