# Pastor's Column

St. Mary Catholic Parish August 07, 2022 - Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Sacraments: the Sacraments of Initiation

As we know (hopefully, we should know!), there are seven Sacraments that the Church was given by Jesus Christ to initiate us and sustain us in the life of grace here on Earth. Here is a simple three-part definition of Sacrament: an outward sign, instituted by Christ, to effect grace. This is true of each of the seven Sacraments.

There are three broad categories of the Sacraments: the Sacraments of Initiation, of Healing, and of Vocation (or of Mission). The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist (or First Communion for the initiated). The Sacraments of Healing are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. The Sacraments of Vocation are Holy Matrimony and Holy Orders. In this Pastor Column, we consider the Sacraments of Initiation.

Baptism is the Sacrament of Initiation, insofar as Baptism needs to happen first before any of the other Sacraments or any other aspect of the sacramental life of the Church can begin. Baptism must use "living water" (that is, water poured upon the initiated person, or else we have the initiated person be immersed in the water). Accompanying the water, the baptizer (ordinarily, this would be a bishop, a priest, or a deacon) must say the words, "N.N., I baptize you in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In instances of imminent death (for example, a car accident where someone is most certainly going to die very soon), anybody can perform the Baptism, even a non-baptized person, even an atheist! Provided that they use water as well as the correct Trinitarian formula.

Confirmation is that Sacrament whereby we are sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit. At Confirmation, we are perfected in baptismal grace, strengthened (confirmed) in the gifts of the Holy Spirit, empowered to give witness to Jesus Christ and to go out to all the world to proclaim the Gospel; at Confirmation, in short, we are now fully prepared, spiritually and sacramentally, to be active and intentional disciples of Jesus Christ. We are confirmed in our Godgiven vocation at Confirmation, whether God has planned for us to be married, or a priest, or a religious sister or brother, or even a consecrated single person.

The Eucharist, first given to us at our First Communion, completes our initiation. As Saint Thomas Aquinas teaches us, the Eucharist is the Sacrament of Sacraments, the Source and Summit of our Catholic Christian faith, because whereas the other six Sacraments are given to us by Christ so as to effect the life of Christ within us, the Eucharist in fact is Christ Himself. The Eucharist is the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, of Jesus Christ, fully God and fully man. The Eucharistic Host is not mere bread but in fact is the Sacred Body of Christ, hidden in the mere appearance of bread, though the substance of bread is removed and transformed into the Body of Christ; and the Eucharistic chalice no longer contains mere wine but in fact contains the Precious Blood of Jesus Christ, hidden in the mere appearance of wine, though the substance of wine is removed and transformed into the Blood of Christ.

# St. Mary conference Q3 update

We are conducting home visits for those that we serve with a few exceptions for cases where our neighbors are recovering from COVID-19. In the last quarter we have referred many neighbors requesting rental assistance to Spokane Neighbor Action Partners and they have been great helping distribute \$12M in funding. It has allowed us to help many more of our neighbors in need. Inflation is having an impact on the neighbors that we serve. We are experiencing more requests for groceries and gas in addition to rent and utilities help. Lastly, our June 26th meeting was a picnic on Lake CDA. It was great to spend the afternoon enjoying the great weather and each other's company.

Below is a summary of assistance that we provided to our neighbors this quarter and year to date.

- Q3 Rent/mortgage assistance: 9 neighbors \$6,111.10; YTD: 36 neighbors \$21,940.30.
- Q3 Utility assistance: 10 neighbors \$1,607.20; YTD: 26 neighbors \$5,917.11.
- Q3 Other assistance: 15 neighbors \$779.13. YTD: 35 neighbors \$7,527.86
- Also, we donate \$300 each to SVdP National Disaster Services (responds for domestic needs) and International Relief Funds each quarter.

Thank you to all that make our SVdP conference run smoothly. We are especially thankful for the parishioners that continue to support us through their generous donations. We are also always looking for new members. If you are interested, please reach out to me.


