Pastor's Column

St. Mary Catholic Parish May 08, 2022 - Fourth Sunday of Easter

Indulgences

What is an indulgence? Indulgences (or "gaining an indulgence") are an aspect of Catholic piety and devotion that involves prayer and is connected with Purgatory. To gain an indulgence is, as it were, to get out of Purgatory more quickly so as to enter into the fullness of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Now, Purgatory is not an eternal "third option" of the afterlife. In the end and for eternity, there is only Heaven or hell. If Heaven is a glorious feast, then Purgatory is getting cleaned up and ready for that feast. Purgatory is not a question of *if* someone will get to Heaven (as if the Lord is still trying to make up His mind), but *when* someone will get to Heaven.

Why a soul would be sent to Purgatory and not immediately to Heaven has to do not only with sin but with one's attachment to sin or to anything of Earth. Dying in a state of unrepented mortal sin sends us to hell, but not venial sin. Therefore, a soul still somewhat stained with venial sin at the moment of death will require purgation (from which we get the name "Purgatory"), or purification, to be cleansed of absolutely any and all stain of sin before entering the presence of God. But even if a soul is freed even of all venial sin at the moment of death but still has some undue or inordinate attachment to something of Earth, that attachment also needs to be purified; for example, if I die and have no stain of any sin on my soul, but I feel like I could not enjoy being in Heaven if medium-rare steak were not on the menu, I would not be purified of that attachment, that inordinate desire for tasty steak (which, as great as it is, is not nearly as great as Heaven). Thus purified, I would be ready for Heaven.

Gaining indulgences is a way of making the "when" happen faster, as it were. (It is a tricky thing to speak of the passing of time as we know it when we are talking about dimensions of reality that are beyond time because they are eternal...but for the sake of argument, we will speak of the passage of time in these references to "when" and Purgatory happening "faster.")

Now, to gain indulgences is an aspect of Catholic piety and devotion. The immediate fruits are graces gained for those for whom we are striving to gain the indulgence (that is, for oneself or for others), and also that the one gaining the indulgence is, by the practice of the act itself, growing in his or her practice of prayer and spiritual life. For example: if I want to gain an indulgence for a relative who died, that relative gains graces as a fruit of my prayers, and I myself will have grown in my own prayer life.

The process, as it were, of gaining an indulgence usually involves four specific things:

Engaging in the specific prayer practice or devotional action (see below)

Going to confession and attaining thereby to a total detachment from sin

Receiving Holy Communion

Praying for the pope (usually by praying the "Our Father" or the "Hail Mary")

There are many specific prayer practices and devotional actions that are available for us to gain an indulgence. Some of the most common include:

Pray for at least a half-hour of Adoration in the Presence of the Blessed Sacrament

Pray the Rosary with your family or with another group

Pray the Rosary privately before the Blessed Sacrament

Read Sacred Scripture for at least a half-hour

Pray the Stations of the Cross in a parish church or on other holy grounds (such as a retreat house, a mission church or chapel, or a cemetery)

Praying for the Poor Souls while visiting a cemetery

History of Holy Land Handicrafts

The handicrafts trade in the Holy Land has evolved as a cultural tradition of the Holy land people over many centuries and has become an industry of significance to the local economy. Beautiful handmade souvenirs made from the native olive tree provide Christian pilgrims with cherished memorials of their holy pilgrimage. Olivewood artisans use only the pruned and discarded pieces of young olive trees and sprouts from the old, unproductive trees. The artistry of Mother-of-Pearl is a tradition traced to the earth 17th century and has evolved along with the olivewood trade.





The ancient crafts of olivewood and Mother-of-Pearl started in Bethlehem hundreds of years ago when Franciscan monks trained the local population in carving Crosses, crucifixes, and reproductions of the Nativity scene of Jesus birth in Bethlehem and the Holy Sepulcher of Jerusalem. The demand for souvenirs from the Holy Land can be traced to the early centuries of Christianity and the tradition of relic hunters. For centuries, early Christians believed in the spiritual powers of relics, the most sought after being The Holy Grail—the name of a legendary sacred vessel identified with the chalice of the Eucharist-and The True Cross, the actual cross on which Christ was crucified, believed to have been lost when carried into battle during one of the Crusades. Centuries later, Christians learned to satisfy their hunger for relics with other artifacts from the Holy Land, including ordinary stones which have been transported to every part of the earth by pilgrims. Historical documents and writing of Christian pilgrims over the centuries tell of the beauty of the olivewood souvenirs.

The proceeds are to support Christian Catholic families in the Holy Land since it is the major source of income for them there. We got our wares from more than 75 families in Bethlehem. They are very beautiful and unique items. (Nativities, Crucifixes, Rosaries, Statues).

The Christian population has dropped from 22% to less than 2% in the past two decades. And this is a way to support them stay there.




