# Reflection on The Gospel

"...when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

John 20:19:31

On this Second Sunday of Easter, in John's Gospel, Jesus says to the disciples and us, "Peace be with you." Interestingly, Paul used a similar phrase when closing his letter to the Thessalonica community, "May the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times and in every way". (2 Thess. 3:16) Additionally, when comparing the dates of Paul's letter and John's Gospel, we discover Paul's encouraging words on peace that preceded John's writing. The Thessalonian letter was composed between 50-55 A.D., while John's gospel is dated 90-95 A.D. Therefore, from a biblical viewpoint, Paul's writing established the tradition of greeting the faith community, and we the Church, to always experience peace. In every way, even amid fear, we should experience God's peace.

However, since Jesus is the Prince of Peace, mentioned by the prophet Isaiah in the Old Testament (Is. 9:6), we always embrace Jesus' greeting of peace. Although the disciples were fearful of the Jewish leaders, Jesus proclaimed, "Peace be with you." Get this! Jesus avoided admonishing the disciples because of their lack of faith. Through His resurrection power, we see Jesus took away the disciple's fears and offered them "peace that surpasses all" human understanding. Here, as Paul prayed, we always have peace and in every way. Nevertheless, Jesus speaks more eloquently when He says, "Peace be with you."

For this reason, I have found joy in seeing so many people who did not let locked Church doors prevent us from hearing these soothing words of faith, "Peace be with you."

Here at St. Teresa of Avila, locked church doors did not stop us from worshipping the Lord. Miraculously, the community of unsung saints, guided by the Holy Spirit, made it possible for our pastor to greet us every Sunday morning virtually online with *Peace be with you*. No one knows the fear that the technicians, lectors, and those who set up the environment experienced, nor the amount of money used to produce the quality videos for us to worship the Lord. Remember, we were at the beginning stages of a Pandemic that closed Churches around the world. I believe that Jesus said to these individuals, "Peace be with you," as they gave their fears to Jesus.

When reflecting further on locked church doors, my thoughts went to individuals who clean the church to ensure our community's safety. Week after week, they dressed in protective gear, left their homes and the virtual Mass to wipe and spray chemicals to disinfect the church. Are you kidding me? Talking about being on the front line, these individuals used the whole armor of the gospel of Jesus to stand in the gap. You know they heard Jesus' words, "Peace be with you."

One must also include the ministers of the altar who clean the linen, Chalice, paten, and other sacred items used, and needed by the pastor weekly. How did these courageous individuals dismiss the fear of COVID-19? They, too, must have heard Jesus today saying, "Peace be with you."

This list is endless. From the Choir Director to STA Communications, Lectors, Health Ministry, the Finance Committee, the Men of St. Teresa (M.O.S.T.), Sodality, Faith Links (small groups), and all other ministries in our faith community, God blessed us. Therefore, hear these words from Jesus, "Peace be with you." We will gather soon. Until then, Paul said, "May the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times and in every way."

Parishioners who are particularly vulnerable (e.g., over the age of 60, those with serious underlying health conditions: high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, asthma, and those whose immune system is compromised, heart or lung conditions, or who are immune compromised), and those who are ill or suspect they may be ill, should remain at home. Livestreaming of our Sunday Mass on our STA YouTube and Facebook Live channels will continue each Sunday, with Mass at 9:30 a.m.
