March 18th, Fifth Sunday of Lent In the first reading, Jeremiah preaches the new covenant, when the law of the Lord is internalized and written upon the hearts of all who believe. With a new heart, we will have knowledge and obedience of God's will. John describes this knowledge and obedience in Jesus, who realizes that, like the grain of wheat, he must die to this world in order to produce much fruit.

Why Fasting?

Fasting is an invitation to strip off distractions and make more room for God.

It may not sound appealing at first, but fasting is one of the greatest blessings God gives to us during lent. Our distractions are too numerous to count. When we eliminate one or more of them - snacks, or TV time or gossip - we open up time and space for God. We move beyond the thing we are giving up and embrace the gift that God has for us. Perhaps it's a word of encouragement from Scripture or an insight about someone we love or a softer heart toward a difficult neighbor, co-worker or love one.

Fasting can open the door to these simply gifts because we are more able to recognize them in our lives.

There's another blessing to fasting, one that we don't even think about. That same time and space that we give to God is also a sacred gift that we give to ourselves. When we set aside this time and space, we are asking the Lord to be more present to us. We are asking him to give us a deeper taste of his love and a deeper sense of his comfort and healing.

So pray about what types of things might be good for you to fast from. Remember, this is a season of grace, and God is more than willing to shower his blessings on you as you seek him.

"Father, through my fasting and prayer this Lent, help me to glimpse the glory you have promised."

TAKE ACTION NOW!

In his recent Executive Budget proposal, Governor Andrew Cuomo included a radical bill that would expand late-term abortions in New York State. The language at this proposal is similar to past attempts, but goes even further by legalizing infanticide when a baby is born alive during an attempted abortion.

The bill also would eliminate New York's ban on late-term abortions, empower non-doctors to perform abortions, and remove protections against unwanted or coerced abortions. The enacted state budget requires three-way negotiation and must be finalized by April 1. The State Senate is our only hope to stop this horrific abortion scheme. Please let your State Senator know that they must not allow the state budget to be used as a vehicle for expanding late-term abortion and legalizing infanticide.

- 3. Click on budget bill S7511/ A 9511
- 4. Click on the small red link on the top left: Take Action Now.

WHY LENT.....

Sometimes we think that Lent is all about our turning back to the Lord in repentance. But Lent is also about God reaching out to us, offering us a torrent of healing love and merciful grace.

It's about God doing everything in his power to set things right with us.

The "Wing" of Fasting.

St. Augustine, one of the great Fathers of the Church, once said, "Do you want your prayer to fly toward God? Then give it two wings: fasting and almsgiving."

For Augustine, fasting was a way to help us pay closer attention to God, to other people, and to the way we are living.

Spiritual fasting is a decision to give up food so that we can draw closer to God.

Giving up things for Lent helps us refocus our attention on the Lord.

Feast on words that purify.
Fast from anger. Feast on patience.
Fast from pessimism. Feast on optimism.
Fast from worry. Feast on Divine Providence.
Fast from complaining. Feast on appreciation.

Fast from self-concern.
Feast on compassion for others.
Fast from anxiety. Feast on trust.
Fast from discouragement. Feast on hope.
Fast from idle gossip. Feast on purposeful silence.

Feast on promises that inspire.
Fast from judging others.

SAINT OF THE MONTH ST. PATRICK

Patron Saint of Ireland

St. Patrick was born in Scotland in the year 387. At sixteen he was captured by pirates and sold as a slave to a chief in Ireland. While tending sheep in the mountains, he prayed constantly.

After six years, a voice from heaven told him to go back to his own country. But first he went to Rome, where he became a priest. He was then sent to England where he labored for the Church for some time. He wanted, however, to return to Ireland, and he begged the Pope to send him there. The Pope made him a bishop and then sent him as a missionary to Ireland.

One of the pagan kings of Ireland arrested Patrick. When he saw the miracles worked by Patrick, he said, "Tell us about your God. He has given you great power."

"There is but one God," answered Patrick, "and three divine persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit." Picking up a green shamrock he said, "Even as there are three leaves on this one stem, so there are three persons in one God." Thereafter he was allowed to preach the new Faith everywhere in Ireland.

O God, You sent St. Patrick to preach your glory to the Irish people. Through his merits and intercession grant that we who have the honor of bearing the name of Christians may constantly proclaim your wonderful designs to men.
