Through this very difficult time, I found myself rejoicing in my trials, since the intimacy with God, my wife, and you my brothers and sisters was so deep and present to me! I am grateful to be alive, grateful to be loved by God, grateful to be a member of City of the Lord, and grateful for each of you!
