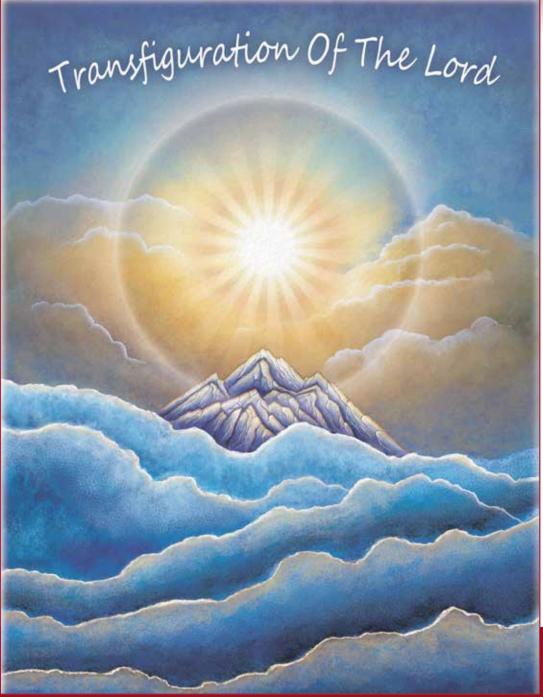

Do You Know the Signs of Heart Attack or Stroke?

A heart attack or a stroke can be a frightening experience. According to the American Heart Association, tens of thousands of people survive heart attacks and go on to lead productive enjoyable lives. The key is knowing the warning signs and symptoms of both in order to save yourself or a loved one. If you start to experience the signs of a heart attack or a stroke, then you should call 911 immediately. Here is what you need to know to be prepared:

What is a Heart Attack?

A heart attack is when the blood flow that brings oxygen to the heart is reduced or severely cut off. According to the American Heart Association, this happens because coronary arteries that supply the heart muscle with blood flow can become narrowed from a buildup of fat, cholesterol or other substances that together are called plaque. This slow process is known as atherosclerosis. The signs for a heart attack can be different for men and women.



Signs and Symptoms for Men Heart attack symptoms for men include:

- Chest discomfort. Most of the time it is in the center of the chest and lasts for more than a few minutes. It can go away and return. The discomfort can feel like pressure, squeezing, fullness, or pain
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body including pain or discomfort in one or both arms, back, neck, jaw, or stomach
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort
- Other signs like cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

Signs and Symptoms for Women

Women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. They are more likely than men to experience other symptoms like shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain.

- Uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, or pain in the center of your chest. It can last for a few minutes or go away and come back again
- Pain or discomfort in one or both arms, back, neck, jaw, or stomach
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort
- Breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness

What is a Stroke?

According to the American Stroke Association, stroke is a disease that affects the arteries leading to and within the brain. It is the No. 5 cause of death and a leading cause of disability in the United States. A stroke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain is either blocked by a clot or bursts (or ruptures). When that happens, part of the brain cannot get the blood (and oxygen) it needs, so it and brain cells die. It's important to know the signs and symptoms of a stroke so that you can seek medical attention immediately.

Signs and Symptoms of Stroke

Learn the acronym BE FAST: B alance: Are you feeling off balance?

- E yes: Are you having trouble seeing or are you experiencing a loss in vision?
- F ace Drooping: Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Is the person's smile uneven or lopsided? Arm Weakness: Is one arm weak
- A rm Weakness: Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to lift up both arms. Does one arm drift downward? S peech: Is speech slurred?
- Ask them to repeat a simple sentence to you. T ime to call 911: If a person is
- T ime to call 911: If a person is showing any of these symptoms, then it is time to call 911. When Should You Call 911?

Learn the signs of a heart attack or a stroke and remember that even if you're not sure, it's better to have it checked out. Minutes matter and fast action can save lives. Call 911 if you experience a heart attack or stroke warning signs. Calling 911 is almost always the fastest way to get lifesaving treatment. An emergency medical services (EMS) team can begin treatment when they arrive. Learn these signs and symptoms so you feel prepared! If you are experiencing a life-threatening emergency. go directly to the ER or dial 911.
