



PROFESSION OF FAITH

Amen.

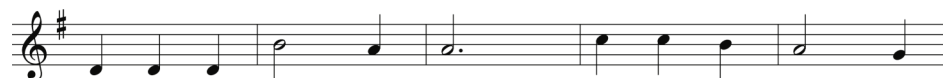

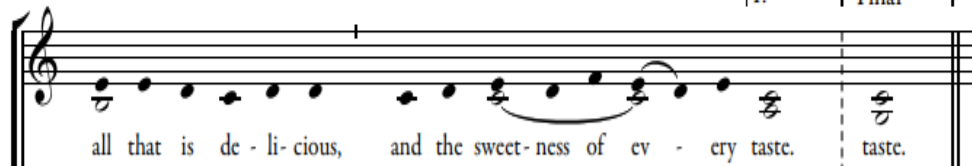
