Why does the priest wear a stole during **Confessions or a blessing?**

If you remember from a few weeks ago, we talked about the different vestments that priests wear. The stole (pictured here) is one of the most distinctly priestly vestments. When a

priest wears his stole, he is indicating that he is acting in a priestly role, whether that be for confessions, a blessing, or Mass. He specifically wears the stole during Confessions as an outward sign to show his priestly role as the mediator between God and the penitent (and not just some random person listening in on your sins!). Extra fun fact: the stole worn for confessions is always

purple, since purple is the color of penance. For blessings, priests are encouraged to wear a stole for a more formal blessing (renewal of marriage or baptismal vows, blessing with holy water, etc.); however, they are not required to wear a stole for blessings over objects or individual people.


