

Did you know?

### Why do we have to fast before receiving the most Holy Eucharist?

The practice of fasting before Mass is an ancient discipline, present as early as the 2nd century. It remained in place until Pope Pius XII reduced the fast to three hours in 1957. The fast was further shortened in 1964 when Pope Paul VI lowered it to one hour before reception of Communion.

The current *Code of Canon Law* reflects this change and states, "A person who is to receive the Most Holy Eucharist is to abstain for at least one hour before holy communion from any food and drink, except for only water and medicine" (Canon 919 §1).

There are exceptions, "The elderly, the infirm, and those who care for them can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if they have eaten something within the preceding hour" (Canon 919 §3). But why? What does it matter if I ate something before church on a day that I intend to receive the Holy Eucharist?

Jesus knew the power of fasting and went into the desert without food for 40 days before setting out on his public ministry. Furthermore, he taught his disciples that, "This kind [of demon] cannot be driven out by anything but prayer and fasting" (Mark 9:29).

Fasting builds up our spiritual strength, and the Church asks us to complete this simple task every time we receive Holy Communion for our own benefit. We have to exercise to strengthen our muscles, discipline and fasting is great for building those spiritual muscles. Without fasting we can become weak and our passions can drive us.

Additionally, Pope Saint John Paul II lamented in *Dominicae Cenae* how modern Catholics possess a "lack of Eucharistic 'hunger' and 'thirst,' which is also a sign of lack of adequate sensitivity towards the great sacrament of love and a lack of understanding of its nature." We need to "hunger" and yearn for the Eucharist before we can properly receive it. Our reception of Holy Communion needs to be a part of our inner hunger that thirsts for God's love. To fast before Holy Communion reminds us how important it is to prepare ourselves to receive the Body of Christ, that it is not just bread, but the Body, Blood Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ.


### Coffee, Donuts, Hospitality and Socials!

# Local Food Pantry Talking Turkey

The Society of St. Vincent DePaul, the operator of the Sacred Heart Food Pantry, is now signing up qualified applicants to receive a complete Thanksgiving meal consisting of a frozen turkey, stuffing, cranberry sauce, potatoes, vegetables, gravy, a pie,

and dinner rolls. Sign-ups will begin at the food pantry on Saturday, October 23, from 8:30 am to 11:00 am and continue any time the pantry is open. The Sacred Heart Food Pantry is open the first four Saturdays of the month from 8:30 am to 11:00 am. It is also open on the first and third Wednesdays of the month from 8:30 am to 11:00 am and on the second and fourth Wednesdays of the month from 4:00 pm to 6:30 pm. The last day to register will be Saturday, November 20, before 11:00 am. The food pantry is



located in the basement of the Sacred Heart Church parish hall located at 53 Oak Street in Middleboro. If you cannot make it to the food pantry because of health concerns, please call 508-947-1717, select option # 1, and leave a message. Someone from the pantry will contact you

Thanksgiving meals will be available to anyone in need, whether or not you are already a pantry recipient. If you're not a pantry recipient, in order to qualify you must live in Middleboro, Lakeville, Rochester, or Carver and provide proof of residency, such as a utility bill, tax bill, lease agreement, or similar document dated within the last 60 days. You will also need to meet USDA income guidelines for food assistance set under TEFAP, which you already do if you are qualified for USDA SNAP benefits.

The meals will be distributed from the food pantry on Tuesday, November 26 between 9:00 am and 6:00 pm. If you fail to pick up your meal, you will be ineligible to sign up for any holiday meal for the entire next year.

The food pantry is planning to provide close to 300 meals this year. If anyone wishes to donate toward this event, send your check to the Society of St. Vincent DePaul, P.O. Box 1381, Middleboro, MA, 02346. Please put "Holiday Meals" in the memo space.

### Mass Settings:

During the summer months we used primarily the Mass settings of the Peoples Mass and the Danish Amen Mass. Many "older" parishioners might remember these as some of the most common settings after the Mass transitioned from Latin to English in the 1960s. These settings were revised to go along with the new translation of the Mass which occurred in the fall of 2011. It's hard to believe that that is now ten years ago!

With the start up of the choir season we began using a variety of Mass settings rather than just one Mass composition as I thought it would be a nice variation. The Heritage Mass provides our Penitential Act, the Holy, Holy, and the Acclamation of Faith, while we continue using the simple, chantlike Gloria. The Gospel Acclamation is taken from the Mass of Christ the Savior, frequently used at Sacred Heart Church. The last two settings, the Great Amen and the Lamb of God, were used on Boston Common on October 1, 1979, when Pope John Paul II made his momentous visit to the United States and celebrated Mass there. (Did anyone from St. Isidore Parish attend this Mass?) The Great Amen is part of the Mass in Honor of Jesus Christ, written specially for the Pope's Mass, and the Lamb of God is a composition by the late Lucien Deiss. We will continue using these settings through the fall to the great feast of Christ the King Sunday, this year on Nov. 21, that feast being the last Sunday of the Liturgical Year. Do we use the gift of life to help one another, as Jesus would, or do we squander each day getting caught up in the everyday tasks of life? 
