

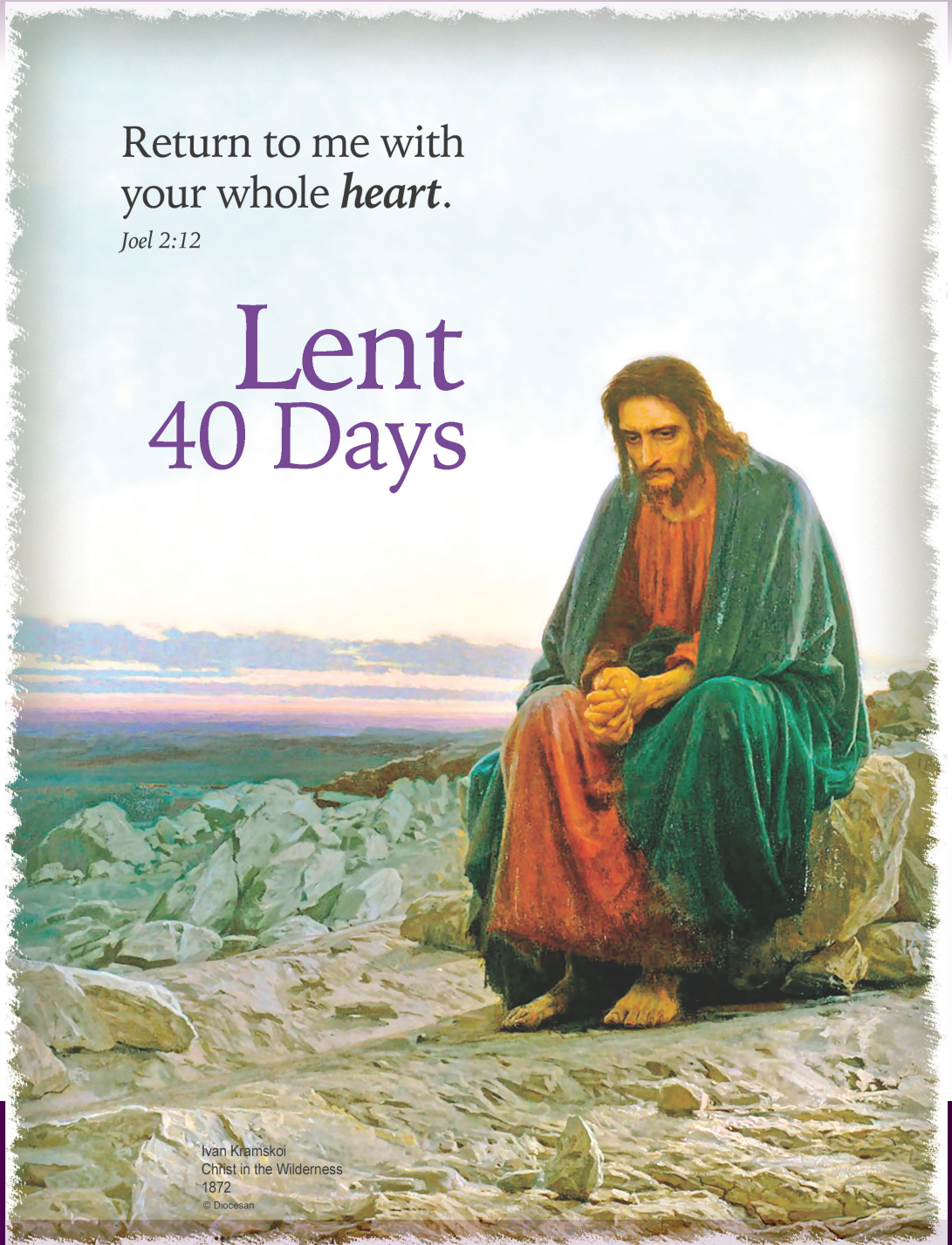

We will continue to offer the Sunday liturgy on our web site. When possible, we hope to offer other spiritual reflections, words of comfort as we journey together during these trying times. It is a work in progress. In addition to the liturgy being offered, I will also pray the prayers of healing

for those that are suffering because of illness.

If any of you are in need of assistance, please do not hesitate to reach out to us. The generosity of so many people have been a blessing to God's people because we have been able to meet the needs of an increasing number of folks requesting assistance.

Things and directives are changing on an ongoing basis. Please check our web page [stjamesnovi.org](http://stjamesnovi.org) on a daily basis to keep up on the latest developments.

There will be opportunities for confession. As of this writing, appointments can be made for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. There should be an extreme need (serious sin) in order to make an appointment. In all other situations, a sincere Act of Contrition is advised.

During last week's announcements on the web site, I mentioned that there have been inquiries about the Sunday collection. I want to emphasize again that **your primary focus** should be on the needs that require your attention as far as **providing for the necessities of your household:** medical needs, food, bills, and whatever other things that must be addressed. I ask you to consider, however, to sacrifice by continuing your contributions to the parish as you are able, either by on line giving or by sending in your contributions through the mail. We have had in increase of people asking for assistance. The everyday expenses of the parish still must be addressed. **I am asking you to consider sacrifice, not burden.** You and your family needs must be considered first.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As citizens of Michigan, we join with our neighbors in observing measures to address the spread of COVID-19. As we continue to practice social distancing to limit the virus' spread, our response as the Body of Christ must always begin in faith. We believe Jesus is still Lord. We believe that God can bring good from this time. We believe that we are not abandoned but remain – however mysteriously – in the loving hands of the Father.

It is with great sadness that I have to announce to you that Holy Week celebrations will not be offered publicly this year in the Archdiocese of Detroit. To ensure we cooperate with and support the governor and local health officials during this time as well as assuring you of my continued commitment to the work of unleashing the Gospel, I am issuing these directives regarding the life of our parishes, the administration of the Sacraments – particularly to those who are sick and dying – and the celebration of Holy Week.

While it is not possible for us to gather in our parishes during Holy Week and on Easter, it is possible for us to be connect-

ed in other ways. I ask you to remain attentive to [aod.org](http://aod.org) and [spiritualcloseness.org](http://spiritualcloseness.org) for ways to be connected with each other during these days. I would also ask you to please continue your financial support to your parish. They rely entirely on your contributions and your generosity. I am very grateful for your support, especially during this time.

In addition, I ask all the faithful in the Archdiocese of Detroit to join me, the Holy Father and faithful around the world in these two times of prayer this week:

Wednesday, March 25 – the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord – to pause at 12 noon to pray the Our Father.

Friday, March 27 to pray at 1:00 p.m. (in union with the Holy Father in Rome) and, as you are able, to receive the Plenary Indulgence that will accompany the Eucharistic Benediction from the Holy Father on this occasion.

I know this is an unprecedented time in the life of our local Church. But unprecedented challenges bring unprecedented graces. If we unite ourselves to the Lord we will emerge from these days of trial and uncertainty more ready to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Please know of my prayers for you and our whole State of Michigan during these days. Asking the intercession of Our Lady of Lourdes, I remain

## **From Your Parish Nurse**

### **Ease the strain of financial stress**

Perhaps money can't buy love, but it just might bring heartburn.

The strain of financial worry can lead to headaches, an upset stomach, sleep troubles, and even colds or flu. It can also contribute to depression and chronic conditions such as heart disease.



To reduce the symptoms of financial strain, you need to take steps to take control of your finances:

**Create a plan.** Make a list of the bills that are gnawing at you. Track what you spend, create a budget, and pay off debt.

**Involve the family.** Write down ideas for reducing expenses.

**Leave debit and credit cards at home.** Avoid impulse buys by bringing only a budgeted amount of cash.

**Ask for help.** Talk to your credit card or utility company about payment plans.

Look into financial education programs.

### **3 sensible ways to keep your budget on track**

A written budget not only

shows you where your money is going, it holds you accountable for what's being spent. Here are some ways to keep expenses in line:

**Take the free entertainment challenge.** Brainstorm with family members to find fun, free events and activities. Options might include tennis at a local park, a bike ride around town, a trip to the local library, or concerts in the park.

**Pay attention to what you're watching.** Online streaming and cable expenses can add up. Cancel services you don't use.

**Map out your meals.** Plan a week of meals to enjoy at home rather than grabbing dinner at a fast food restaurant.

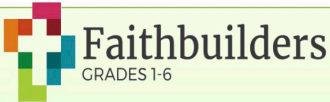

*John 11:1-45 Jesus Brings Lazarus Back to Life*

Lazarus was a friend of Jesus and the brother of Martha and Mary from Bethany.

When he became seriously ill, his sisters sent word to Jesus that Lazarus was in danger of dying.

Four days later Jesus began the journey to Bethany. When He arrived both Martha and Mary both said, "If you had been here, our brother would not have died." This statement demonstrated their faith in Jesus but He wanted them to go one step further. When He raised Lazarus He demonstrated His power over death. He waited until Lazarus had died in order to

glorify His Father in heaven and create hope for those present and us all.

These days we are in our own cocoons of a sort. From the street, people may see little activity coming from our houses. We may even feel as if our lives are on hold and time is being wasted. But inside things are happening. Families are praying together. Children are reading and playing creative games. Parents are becoming teachers and family time is no longer an option. 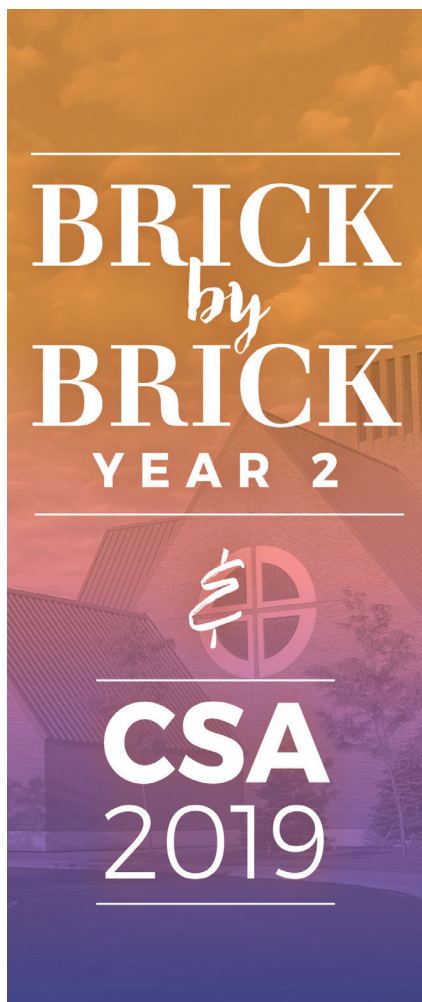
