

#### FROM PADRE

(CONTINUATION OF OUTLINE OF POPE FRANCIS' ENCYCLICAL)

AN ABSENCE OF HUMAN DIGNITY ON THE BORDERS: Pope Francis reflects on the reality that certain populist political regimes, as well as certain liberal economic approaches, maintain that an influx of

migrants is to be prevented at all costs. Behind these approaches many lives are at stake. "Many migrants have fled war, persecution and natural catastrophes. Others, 'rightly,' are seeking opportunities for themselves and their families. They dream of a better future and they want to create the conditions for achieving it." The Pope also refers to the "unscrupulous" traffickers, gang cartels and arms cartels that exploit the weakness of migrants. The migrant often experiences violence, psychological and physical abuse and untold suffering on the journey. The Pope also encourages "the right not to emigrate, that is, to remain in one's homeland."

In some host countries, migration causes fear and alarm. Again the Pope challenges us: "No one will ever openly deny that they (the migrants) are human beings, yet in practice, by our decisions and the way we treat them, we can show that we consider them less worthy, less important, less human. For Christians, this way of thinking and acting is unacceptable."

THE ILLUSION OF COMMUNICATION: In this section the Pope asks us to reflect on the illusion of communication. "Digital media can expose people to the risk of addiction, isolation and a gradual loss of contact with concrete reality, blocking the development of authentic interpersonal relationships. They lack the physical gestures, facial expressions, moments of silence, body language and even smells, the trembling of hands, the blushes and perspiration that speak to us and are a part of human communication ... Digital connectivity is not enough to build bridges. It is not capable of uniting humanity."

SHAMELESS AGGRESSION: Pope Francis warns against what he calls "social aggression." He refers to the hostility, insults, abuse, defamation and verbal violence often found on social media. Social aggression has found unparalleled room for expansion through computers and mobile devices. "Nor should we forget that there are huge economic interests operating in the digital world, capable of exercising forms of control that can be invasive and creating the manipulation of consciences."


## CHRISTMAS FLOWERS AND DECORATIONS

At St. Ann, there is a table at the back entrance. (Do not leave money in these areas.)
