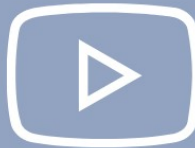

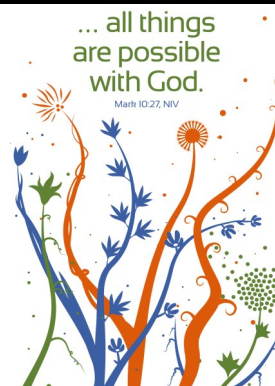
Vision Prayer

From the Archdiocese



Yes, there will be a 2021 Assembly of the People of God!

However, it will be different from other years. The 2021 Assembly will be the beginning of a synodal process in the Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth.

On October 10, 2021 Pope Francis will open the 16th Ordinary Assembly of the Synod of Bishops with the theme “*For a synodal church: communion, participation, mission.*” Unlike other years, it’s not a one-time event, but rather a process he’s inviting the WHOLE Church to take part in. The Holy Father Francis has asked bishops around the world to officially open the Synod in each of their dioceses the weekend of October 16-17. The purpose: to gather feedback from the faithful that will help the Pope understand how the mission of the Church is being lived around the world. With this in mind, Archbishop Dunn decided this year’s Assembly would focus on the synodal process and will be held at Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, **Saint Peter’s Church, 10 Maple St. in Dartmouth** on October 15 and 16.

Friday, October 15 is open to all and takes place from 7:00pm to 9:00pm via livestream and in person! You must pre-register at the [diocesan website](#) to attend in person. **Saturday October 16** is a formation and training day for parish selected delegates *ONLY*.



Tiny Shelters Program

Many of us have seen the increasing news coverage regarding the intense housing

shortage in our Province. In response, Archbishop Dunn named homelessness as one of our four diocesan pastoral priorities. This priority asks all of us to do what we can to combat homelessness and housing insecurity at every level and encounter the Lord Jesus in the those who do without (cf. Matthew 25:45). To that end, Archbishop Dunn invites parishes to consider supporting an emergency tiny shelter.

Winter is coming and the homeless need shelter from harsh conditions. Emergency tiny shelters are one temporary solution. Placing these shelters on church properties provides a measure of protection from eviction on public land. The Archdiocese has established a support team to answer questions and help parishes with this undertaking while continuing to explore other initiatives that will help to bring permanent housing to those in need.

Archbishop Dunn encourages all the faithful to prayerfully consider how our communities of faith can help those in our province who are in great need.

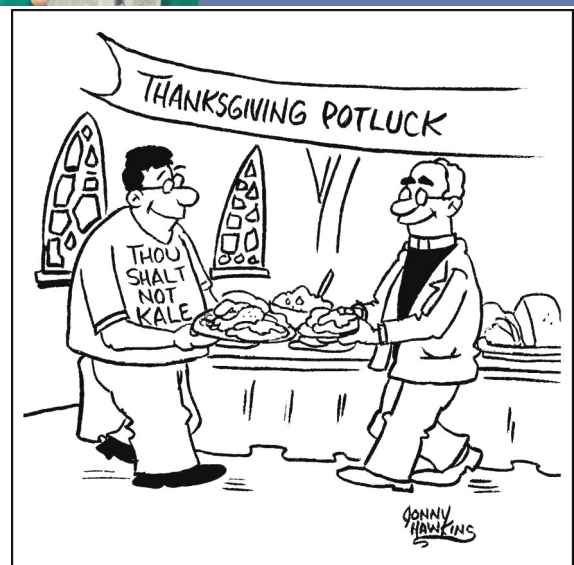

Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishops of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of This Land

We, the Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, take this opportunity to affirm to you, the Indigenous Peoples of this land, that we acknowledge the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. We acknowledge the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. We also sorrowfully acknowledge the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies¹, we², the Catholic Bishops of Canada, express our profound remorse and apologize unequivocally.

We are fully committed to the process of healing and reconciliation. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, and as a further tangible expression of this ongoing commitment, we are pledging to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, we invite the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us in each of our dioceses across the country to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. We commit ourselves to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves.

Having heard the requests to engage Pope Francis in this reconciliation process, a delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in Rome in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous participants, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. We pledge to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey.

We commit ourselves to continue accompanying you, the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. Standing in respect of your resiliency, strength and wisdom, we look forward to listening to and learning from you as we walk in solidarity.

Items of Note

2nd in a Series of Questions & Answers from our Canadian Bishops

“When the Canadian Bishops came together in Plenary Assembly in September, there was consensus that Catholic entities needed to do more to address the suffering experienced in Canada’s residential schools.” (CCCCB) Starting last week, and continuing over these next two weeks, we will provide you with some more information from our Bishops. This is the first in a series of Questions & Answers from our Canadian Bishops. They have prepared these Q&A to provide answers to some commonly asked questions. Here is the second instalment:

Q.
The Truth and Reconciliation Commission calls for Pope Francis to apologize on Canadian soil. Why has this not taken place?

A.
The delegation to Rome will provide Pope Francis with a unique opportunity to hear directly from Indigenous Peoples, express his heartfelt closeness, address the impact of colonization and learn more about the impact of Church involvement in the residential schools..

We view this as an important step in fostering more meaningful dialogue and healing to address the ongoing and historical trauma caused by the residential school system. We are confident that Pope Francis will respond to the suffering of Indigenous Peoples of Canada in a way that expresses the Church’s regrets and sorrow. We recognize that there is much more to do in the long walk towards healing and reconciliation and will continue to work with Indigenous Peoples to guide our efforts. As part of that work, the Canadian Bishops are committed to engaging in a dialogue with the Holy See to ascertain the possibility of an eventual pastoral visit that would include a formal apology.

We will continue to work with the Holy See, and our Indigenous Partners to walk towards a more hopeful future.

Q.
XX has been unable to access any records in relation to the residential school at YY. When will you be releasing these records?

A.
We have heard clearly from our Indigenous partners that here must be Truth before Reconciliation. With this understanding, we have collectively committed to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves, in a manner that respects the confidentiality of residential school survivors and their families. These efforts are intended to complement the independent assessment process established for residential school survivors to obtain records through the Truth and Reconciliation Commission’s Church Archival Records database.

Q.
How much are you aiming to raise?

A.
The Canadian Bishops are pledging to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Our total financial target is \$30M over a maximum of five years. We intend for the fundraising activities to be a grassroots effort, with individual dioceses ensuring that the objectives of healing and reconciliation are achieved and have committed to developing and announcing further details about a national fundraising plan in November.
