About Us

Eighteen years ago, Fr. Marcel Larouche, with the support of his parishioners at Ste-Marie-de-l'Assomption in Green Valley, had the idea of building a Calvary site. They were inspired by Saint Louis-Marie of Montfort who would end his great retreats by constructing a Calvary in the cities and villages where he preached.

Much prayer and labour went into building Calvary of the Divine Mercy. However, were it not for the immense generosity of local businessman, Hubert Sabourin (1929 - 2013) this dream may not have been realized. On August 15, 2004, Bishop Paul-André Durocher officially blessed the Calvary site.

The grounds are open year-round but are at their loveliest during the summer months. From June to September there is a special monthly outdoor Mass and Stations of the Cross (see schedule to the left).

This tranquil setting provides you the chance to pray and meditate on the last hours of Jesus' time on earth.

The Stations

1. Jesus on the Mount of Olives.
2. Jesus, betrayed by Judas, is arrested.
3. Jesus is condemned by the Sanhedrin.
4. Peter denies Jesus.
5. Jesus is judged by Pontius Pilate.
6. Jesus is scourged and crowned with thorns.
7. Jesus takes up the Cross.
8. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus to carry his Cross.
9. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem.
10. Jesus is crucified.
11. Jesus promises His Kingdom to the Good Thief.
12. Jesus on the Cross, his mother and his disciples.
13. Jesus dies on the Cross.
14. Jesus is placed in the tomb.
15. The Resurrection.

The Scriptural Way of the Cross

The Scriptural Way of the Cross is a version of the traditional Stations of the Cross inaugurated as a devotion by Saint Pope John Paul II on Good Friday 1991.

Thereafter, on Good Friday, John Paul II prayed the scriptural version many times at the Colosseum in Rome.

The Scriptural Way of the Cross sheds light on the tragic role of the various characters involved, and the struggle between light and darkness, between truth and falsehood, which they embody. They all participate in the mystery of the Passion, taking a stance for or against Jesus.

The scriptural version is not intended to invalidate the traditional version of the Stations, rather it is meant to add nuance to an understanding of the Passion.

In 2007, Pope Benedict XVI approved the Scriptural Way of the Cross for meditation and public celebration.
