
OUR BENEFICIARIES

OUR IMPACT

When you support the Catholic Charities Appeal, you are helping:

- Over 100 Catholic Social Services and Nutritional Development Services organizations and programs. Last year, close to 640,000 were positively impacted by the work of Catholic Human Services.
- More than 5,800 seniors served in Senior Centers and Parish Programs.
- Over 100 students in the Schools of Special Education within the Archdiocese of Philadelphia receive tuition assistance and support.
- The 18 Programs and Offices that are providing Evangelization, Parish & Spiritual Life to our community.
- 3,900 clients receive pregnancy, and parenting support, and over 8,400 parents receive baby care items.
- 121 Retired Priests who need care and support.
- 18 Mission Parishes in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia revitalize and sustain their parishes. This includes ministering to over 50,000 parishioners.

EDUCATION



Support and Success for Special Education Schools

"St. Lucy School for Children with Visual Impairments is a special place. My daughter, Althea, is in second grade at St. Lucy's, and we consider this school to be family. When Althea first came to St. Lucy School, it changed our lives. They are very welcoming, treat our children just like any other children, and provide the support they need to succeed. St. Lucy's utilizes the same curriculum developed by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia's Office for Catholic Education in their elementary schools. Students gain access to the elementary curriculum through the use of unique accommodations that meet their visual needs. These accommodations include magnification, braille materials, and assistive technology. The tools and resources here at the school, the warm and welcoming environment, and the knowledge that my daughter is receiving a quality Catholic education, makes St. Lucy School the perfect fit for our family.

"St. Lucy School provides a family atmosphere to children with visual impairments. There is something special about the teachers, staff, and children that gather here. Everyone is so supportive of one another. In most educational placements, students with visual impairments may be the only child in a classroom or school who uses a cane or reads braille. At St. Lucy School, children learn side by side with other students who are experiencing challenges with their vision. Because of this unique program, students help one another to learn and grow. Many of the families who attend St. Lucy's do not have the financial means to send their child here, yet they need the benefits of the program that St. Lucy School provides. St. Lucy School offers an academic education with all the support for students to access educational materials through the use of magnification, braille, assistive technology and tactile models in order to meet their learning needs."

Without the support of the Catholic Charities Appeal, our families could not even dream of sending their children to St. Lucy School. Many families of students who are blind/visually impaired want what St. Lucy School can offer, which is an academic education, along with the visual accommodations necessary to their child's particular visual impairment." – Sr. Lisa, Principal, St. Lucy School for Children with Visual Impairments

St. Lucy School for Children with Visual Impairments is the only Catholic School in the United States serving the needs of students with blindness and visual impairments. St. Lucy's helps visually impaired students in Pre-K through 8th grade discover and understand their world, focusing on literacy and personal achievements. Students are also encouraged to attend inclusion classes at other Archdiocesan elementary schools. Last year, St. Lucy School launched a new program for students with Cortical Visual Impairments.

Homeless to Hopeful

"The house I was living in started falling apart, and I had no choice but to leave, but I had nowhere to turn. I was homeless and living on the streets for two years. I don't know how I made it through the winter months, but I know God was with me, looking over me. The streets were getting too dangerous, and I knew I needed shelter. I spoke to my pastor, and he recommended St. John's Hospice. The first time I walked through the doors here, I loved it. St. John's Hospice has clothed me, fed me, and kept me safe. They have also helped support me through counseling, case management services, and anything I could possibly need. Next week I start a new job, and I know this opportunity would not have been possible without the support of the staff here. In addition to helping the 52 residents that call St. John's Hospice home, individuals experiencing homelessness can come to the dining hall for a hot lunch every day. They are met with dignity. Through the support of the Catholic Charities Appeal, these services are made possible. **People are given a second** chance in their life. The Appeal helps feed the hungry and provides shelter to those experiencing homelessness. I don't know where I would be in my life without St. John's Hospice." - John, Resident, St. John's Hospice

Each weekday, St. John's Hospice provides more than 300 hot meals, as well as case management, on-site nursing, daily showers, and mail delivery for over 1,700 men experiencing homelessness in our community.

When I started to look at the prices of everything, I felt overwhelmed, and it made me emotional. A friend recommended I visit Casa del Carmen, and I could not be more grateful. At Casa, I received all the extra items I needed for my daughter: diapers, wipes, a pack and play, and clothing. I even participated in a car seat workshop and learned the proper safety instructions for transporting my child. Services like these are so beneficial to parents, and especially new moms like me.

As a student studying to be a social worker, I know how important the work of Casa del Carmen is in our community. **They are here to help give a helping hand, and through donations to the Catholic Charities Appeal, their work is made possible. Casa del Carmen Family Service Center provides a variety of services and support to the North Philadelphia community. Last year, Casa del Carmen's pregnancy and parenting support program distributed 62,647 diapers, the food pantry provided meals to 2,902 families, and 54 students graduated from their Keystone stars 4 rated preschool.

Serving a Unique Community

"St. Martin of Tours Parish is a unique place. Our parish has five distinctive communities: English, Spanish, Brazilian, Q'eqchi and the Neocatechumenal Way. Each Mass is just as it would be in their native country. The parish supports each community but also helps them understand our traditional Mass so everyone can continue to work together. Each of these groups not only proclaims the word of God, but they also help to bring new people into the Church.

The mission of St. Martin of Tours Parish is to support people no matter where they come from. This parish provides food, shelter, employment,

and even healthcare to those parishioners in need. Our food pantry mainly comes from donations from the parishioners. They support us with different ethnic foods because we are a part of so many different cultures. We help a lot of families.

A New Home Brings Hope

"My husband and I have four beautiful children. Our oldest daughter, Mary Grace, has cerebral palsy and multiple disabilities. Mary Grace is amazing, and I think when you have a child with special needs, you are forever wishing that the world would see them the same way that you do every day. It was important for us to make sure she was welcomed into our parish community and the Office for Persons with Disabilities in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia helped make that possible. From the moment we were connected to the office, they were champions for Mary Grace. Because of our positive experience, we started a ministry at our parish to help other families like ours. It's essential for a parent to have their child seen as an individual and that their faith journey is supported. It is now a goal of our

parish to let everyone know we are here and that our Church community is accessible

Our parish feels like home. I know for many families; Church is a challenge. A lot of life is a challenge. It was so important to us to be welcomed, and that Mary Grace was seen and recognized for the person she is, and that she's different.
