# January Speaker Reflection Susan Mountin, Ph.D., Director

Susan presented a capsule of the life of Dorothy Day. Dorothy was drawn to Catholicism by her need to take care of the poor. One of her passions was being a pivotal person for the Catholic Worker. She was addressing contemporary issues in her writing way before others were even considering these ideas. Dorothy and Peter Maurin started a newspaper in 1933 called <u>The Catholic Worker.</u> This newspaper is still being published today and is focused on the social justices in which the church addresses. You can get a copy for just 1 cent which is the same price as 1933.

Susan challenged us with the following take away...

- Catholic Intelligence, read and learn more about justice and become passionate about it or something you are interested in.
  - Try the US Catholic Bishop Website for daily reading
- Choose a podcast that delves into Catholic teachings and social justice.
  - Refocus on Jesus and his stories. How can you make them come alive and bring into your daily life.
