Whenever I baptize a child, I often tell the parents "Don't drive the Volkswagen, drive the Cadillac!" What I mean by that is that our Catholic faith has so many features, "bells and whistles," so to speak, and we should not overlook our great Catholic heritage as we bring our kids up in the Faith. Don't give them the minimum, but the maximum of our Catholic faith. I guess I should update my metaphor by saying, "Don't use your smart phone as if it were a flip phone!"

This Advent the book we have purchased for each family is Signs of Life: 20 Catholic Customs and Their Biblical Roots. The book is written by noted Catholic author, Scott Hahn. He's in great demand on the lecture circuit and was actually here at Holy Family several years ago. It's not every day we are given the opportunity to buy his book in bulk. It was an offer I couldn't refuse! So take advantage of this great opportunity and grab one for your family. Dr. Hahn talks about where you can find in the Bible very Catholic practices, customs and instruments of our Faith, such as: holy water, the Sign of the Cross, Advent and Christmas, incense, candles, the sacraments, intersession of the saints, the rosary, scapular and more.

As we continue in Advent on our journey toward the coming of the Christ child, I like what he had to say about this season of preparation: "With the birth of Jesus came the fulfilment of all the holy desires of all those many centuries. That is the joy we mark in Christmas, but it's difficult for us to experience the joy unless we first undergo the longing.


"That is why the Church leads us first through a season not of shopping, but of longing. Advent is sometimes called the little Lent, because it is a season of preparatory fasting and self-denial. It is not as long as Great Lent. In fact, it can be as

short as twenty-one days. Yet it still should be a time of some small, daily sacrifices. The apostles fasted to prepare for worship in the Lord's presence (Acts 13:2). We should, too. That empty feeling should serve as a sensible sign of our spiritual need."

RCIA class is growing!

What has been called the "Summer of Shame" in our Church has no doubt affected those who might be thinking about joining the Catholic Church. I do wonder what the numbers will be like throughout our country at the next Easter Vigil given the self-inflicted wounds of some of our clergy and hierarchy. That's why it's so great to see the job Deacon Frank Zammuto is doing in recruiting and catechizing our RCIA class. He told me from the start that his goal is 20. And I'm happy to report we are pretty close to that number! We are sitting at 16 or so, which would represent one of our largest RCIA classes in some time. Given the difficulties of the Church, this is a great sign that the Spirit is still moving in the Catholic Church and at Holy Family. Praise God! And if you know of someone thinking about entering the Church, don't hesitate to contact me or Deacon Zammuto and we would be happy to sit down with them and discuss it. You can be that catalyst that gets us to 20! Because when it comes to bringing in people into the Catholic Church, we are all recruiters!



We just completed our second full year of operations and are pleased to report the following activity by our 29 active volunteer parishioners:

752 individuals were assisted\$47,665 of financial assistance was provided\$6,023 of 'in-kind' goods was provided

Our ability to serve was based solely on the generosity of the Holy Family community, with a significant portion coming from the parish tithe.



As you may be aware, our conference SVdP has several volunteer opportunities as follows:

Home Visitation Team - along with another SVdP volunteer, visits our friends in need (FIN) at their home to provide a 'hand up' not a 'hand out'. THIS IS THE HEART OF WHAT WE DO AND OUR BIGGEST NEED!

Phone Team - takes phone messages from the FINs, inputs data into a data base, and shares with the Home Visitation Team.

Nursing Home Team - coordinated with the facilities, visits to certain residents in nursing homes with an emphasis on St. Anne's.

Prayer Team monthly rosary gathering, offering prayer for our FINs, members, and the society as a whole.

Fundraising Team - conduct fundraising events to support SVdP efforts, i.e. Walk for the Poor, Applebee's Pancake breakfast, Rummage Sale and others. Works with 3 other conferences in Rockford.


Technology - much of our work is documented, and computer support, training, etc. is coordinated by this committee.




