3. Pope laments deaths of migrants in Texas and on Spain's border

Pope Francis expresses his condolences to victims of a tragedy in San Antonio, Texas, in which 46 migrants were found dead in an abandoned lorry in what appears to be a human smuggling attempt along the United States-Mexico border. According to the San Antonio Fire Chief, Charles Hood, another 16 people - including 4 children found in the trailer were transported to hospital in critical condition. Read more

4. 2025 Jubilee Year & Official Logo

The Vatican reveals the <u>official Logo of the upcoming Jubilee Year</u> due to be held in 2025 on the theme 'Pilgrims of Hope' and reflects on some of the Holy Year's early initiatives and plans. The image shows how the pilgrim's journey is not individual, but rather communal, with the signs of a growing dynamism that moves more and more toward the Cross.

5. St. Elizabeth of Portugal (Feast Day July 4)

Elizabeth was born in 1271 into the royal house of Aragon. St. Elizabeth of Hungary was her great-aunt, and baby Elizabeth was named after her. Her father was King Pedro III of Aragon, and his wife's name was Constantia. Queen Elizabeth's patient efforts to bring peace to her home and her kingdom make her a beautiful intercessor for our day.

6. **8 Things You Need To Know About Saint Anthony Zaccaria (Feast Day July 5)** Inspired by Saint Paul, St. Anthony encouraged devotion in the lives of many Catholics. If today is the first time you're hearing about Anthony, here are <u>eight</u> incredible facts about his life.

7. St. Maria Goretti (Feast Day July 6)

July 6 marks the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, a young virgin and martyr whose life is an example of purity and mercy for all Christians. "What does this fragile but christianly mature girl say to today's young people, through her life and above all through her heroic death?" asked the Pope St. John Paul II.

8. St. Augustine Zhao Rong (Feast Day July 9)

On July 9 the Church celebrates the feast of the 120 Martyrs of China. Religious persecution has a long history in China, especially persecution of Christians, thousands of whom have died for their faith in the last millennium.
