WAYS TO SERVE WITHIN ST. MARIA GORETTI

Shepherd's Gate Pantry serves those in need in Hamilton County providing needed resources of food and other products as well as baby supplies. They work in conjunction with our HELP Committee.

The **HELP Committee's** mission is to reach out to those in need right here in Hamilton County by assisting families who have experienced a personal crisis, providing means for an education, or supplying meals and gifts during Thanksgiving and Christmas.

The **St. Vincent de Paul** ministry consists of men and women who strive to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to individuals in our local community who are need of emergency financial assistance. We know that we are not alone. We are part of an international society of friends united by a spirit of poverty, humility, and sharing, which is nourished by prayer and reflection, mutually supportive gatherings, and adherence to a basic Rule of life.

Respect Life organizes the events throughout the year which promote the sanctity of life, from conception through natural death. We as Catholics are called to build the culture of life and to respect the sacredness of human life from conception to natural death. The Respect Life Ministry seeks to promote this teaching through awareness and formation opportunities, coordinating prayer vigils for the parish, and promoting and supporting local apostolates for life.

WAYS TO SERVE IN THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

GROUPS THAT SERVE PREGNANT WOMEN

The O'Connor House Mission is to provide a Christian home to help single, pregnant, homeless women improve life for themselves and their children.

Birthright is an interdenominational organization that helps women through the challenges related to unplanned pregnancies. They offer support to women who are pregnant or think they may be pregnant by offering referrals and free resources of baby items and maternity clothes. birthright.org/cicero

Women's Care Center provides free, confidential counseling, support and education for pregnant women. Free pregnancy testing and ultrasounds help determine viability and dates (prenatal medical care and abortions not provided). One local center is directly next door to Planned Parenthood and offers an easily accessible life-fostering alternative. womenscarecenter.org

ORGANIZATIONS THAT SHELTER HOMELESS

Third Phase is an emergency homeless shelter for Hamilton County residents located in Noblesville. There is also a food pantry on the property to aid local residents. thirdphase.org

The Julian Center is the largest organization supporting victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, and other life crises in Indiana, offering emergency shelter to those leaving these situations.

Holy Family Shelter, a program of Catholic Charities Indianapolis, opened in 1984 as the first emergency shelter specifically for homeless families in Indianapolis. They work to provide food, shelter, basic material needs and a safe place for homeless families to begin the process of working towards permanent housing and self-sufficiency. archindy.org/cc/holyfamily

GROUPS SUPPORTING INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES

The Cooper House is a safe place for families in crisis to receive support in order to keep children safe and families together. They serve: parents whose children are in foster care, or parents who are in crisis, by coming alongside them and set them up for success; families in crisis by providing a safe, welcoming environment for supervised visitations; children that are removed from their homes by providing a safe place to be cared for while the case worker is securing a placement. thecooperhouseindiana.com

Our brothers and sisters at Our Lady of Mount Carmel have the Merciful H.E.L.P. Center, which is a service to resident and homeless disadvantaged people of all ages focusing on Hamilton County to provide food, financial aid, home goods, used furniture and large appliances, used vehicles, home repair, clothing, and other services. MHC assists with referrals for social assistance, housing, jobs, and legal matters in cooperation with other agencies. mercifulhelpcenter.org

The Trinity Free Clinic mission is to provide quality free medical, dental, and health services to the uninsured, underinsured, and low-income residents of Hamilton County with the assistance of a professional, dedicated staff and group of volunteers. trinityfreeclinic.org
