

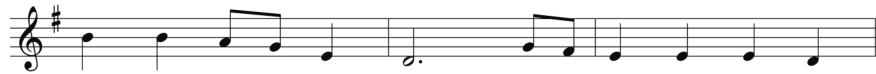

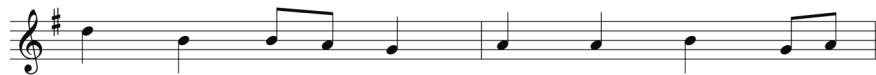

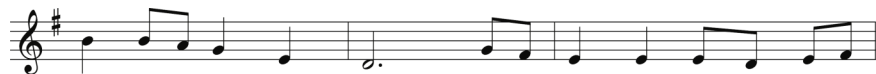

Amen.


## Jerusalem, My Destiny (Vs. 1)
