

Campaign Update—Fellowship Hall and Worship **Enhancements**

In addition to giving everyone a glimpse of what the new fellowship hall and worship improvements look like at all our Masses this weekend, we wanted to hold a forum where we could talk about it more at length and provide a chance for you to offer some input. The forum will take place this Tuesday at 6:30 PM in our Family Room. I encourage you to come. We can't offer the level of detail at our Masses that we can on Tuesday. So come with an open heart and any questions you have as we all seek to make Holy Family a better place for making disciples and building community.

Campaign Update—Maintenance items

As of now, we are working on, or have completed the following items:

School boiler: Asbestos removed (June 2018) in preparation for a new energy-efficient boiler and controls to be installed in the summer 2019.

Gym lights: New energy-efficient LED lighting and control system installed in December 2018. We received a rebate for part of the cost through Com Ed. The gym roof and skylights will be repaired Summer 2019.

School Bathrooms: Two sinks were installed in August 2018, to replace inoperable ones. The remaining bathrooms will be updated Summer 2019. Including new lighting, paint, sinks, urinals, hand dryers, and floor repair.





