

The Holy Name of Mary Family Fellowship is here to connect parishioners on a social and spiritual level to forge stronger bonds with each other through sharing.

The premise is simple. Once a month, on Sundays from 4-6pm, a few families, couples, and/ or individuals will meet to share a meal and read and discuss a scripture passage. There is no need for a deep theological discussion or a five course meal. There will be a host family each month who will be responsible for planning the meal (pizza, potluck, a pot of chili?) and leading the faith discussion (the day's gospel or another reading, or your favorite scripture passage...). Each subsequent month a new family or individual or couple will host. And the participants will rotate so that every time you'll be sharing with a new group of people.

We're looking for folks to come forward and take on the role of being a host on our initial Sunday, February 12. We will provide you with a template of how your evening should run. If you are unable make it in February, please enroll anyway.
