




#### OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

(1999) from the University of Navarra after earlier philosophy studies at San Pablo College Seminary and the University of Santo Tomas. He has ministered in our local Church as parish pastor, Judicial Vicar, and now Vicar General, serving in English, Spanish, Tagalog, and Ilocano.


# The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults



## Father Mark M. Catalana Knights of Coumbus Council Membership Drive

Dear Parishioners,

My name is John Oneto, Grand Knight of the Father Mark M. Catalana Council of the Knights of Columbus. All of our members are parishioners here at St. Thomas of Canterbury Church and one of our primary goals is to support our parish.

The Knights of Columbus is an International organization of Catholic men with Councils in many countries that was founded in 1882 by Blessed Father Michael J. McGivney in New Haven, Connecticut.

The Knights of Columbus advocates for Catholic causes and provides a wide range of services to Catholic institutions worldwide. It is also one of the world's largest insurance companies for its members.

I'm speaking with you this evening/morning because our Council is in danger of closing. We have a small group of seven active members who have accomplished more than many larger councils. But, we have an urgent need for Catholic men of our parish, especially younger ones, to step up to join us.

The primary reason that our Council was founded in January 2015 with 18 members was to honor and remember Father Mark M. Catalana, an extremely charismatic and loved priest.

Father Mark was Director of Seminarians and Vocations for our Diocese from 2000 to 2010. During that period 40 Seminarians were ordained to the priesthood.

Father Mark became our Pastor in 2010. He did not drive a car, instead he rode a bicycle wherever he went. One evening in May 2013, he was riding from San Tomas Express onto Winchester Blvd. As he entered Winchester his handlebar caught on the side view mirror of an oncoming automobile which resulted in his untimely death. Our current parishioners for whom Father Mark was our Pastor still mourn his sudden loss.


Hopefully, you can understand what a fine, holy priest Father Mark was and some of you will join our Council to keep his memory alive for as long as we can. The Knights of Columbus will always be here to support us.

Annual dues are only \$45. How much time you devote to Council activities is up to you. Most of our activities are on weekends and only require two to four hours.

Our activities include hosting Handicaples, fund raising dinners, turkeys and hams to needy families in our parish for Thanksgiving and an Advent Coat Drive for Needy and Homeless people.

Members of our Council are at the doors of the Church with an information sheet on how you can join our Council online or with a paper application. You get a free membership for the rest of the year if you join Online. It's the preferred method.

In conclusion, our Knights of Columbus Council is a small group of men who work well together and we welcome you to join us.

# St. Thomas of Canterbury Community Connections Mental Health Ministry







The figures represent humanity from the four corners of the World. They are embracing each other to illustrate the solidarity between the peoples, as the first holds onto the cross.





# Jubilee Year 2025



Jubilee Year 2025 - The Holy Father has decided that 2025 will be the year of Jubilee, something which happens every 25 years.

The theme is <u>"Pilgrims of Hope,"</u> and it will be a year of hope for a world suffering the impacts of war, the ongoing effects of the COVID-19 pandemic, and a climate crisis.

The 2025 Jubilee will officially open on December 24, 2024, at 7pm with a Mass presided over by Pope Francis in St. Peter's Square.

The door will remain open until the end of the Jubilee Year on January 6, 2026.

#### Have a check-in chat

- · Ask someone how they are doing
- · Really listen to their answers

### 2. LEARN MORE

## Learn when your chosen support system can be helpful:

- Becoming anxious, worried, or overwhelmed all the time
- Being unable to focus on work or school
- Withdrawing from friends and activities
- · Feeling sad, hopeless or helpless
- Having difficulty coping with daily problems or stress
- Using more alcohol or drugs than usual or more often
- Acting moody or irritable
- Changing from healthy eating or sleeping patterns to non-healthy eating or sleeping patterns



## 3. GET SUPPORT



Talk openly with someone you trust about what you are experiencing.

Seek help from a mental health professional or your chosen support system.





Connect with others through a Peer support group.

Stay in touch with people who care about you. Tell them specific things they can do to support.
