Dear Friends.

"A parish is a definite community of the Christian faithful established on a stable basis within a particular Church; the pastoral care of the parish is entrusted to a pastor or a lay ecclesial minister under the direction of a pastor as its own shepherd under the authority of the diocesan bishop" (No. 515). We build a sense of community within the parish, particularly through the celebration of the Mass. For this reason, under normal circumstances, adults are to be baptized in their parish church and infants in the parish church of their parents; couples are to be married in the parish where either the bride or groom lives.

Through the spirit and practice of the laity and clergy working together to foster this community, the relationship of the parish to the bishop is strengthened ("Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy," No. 42).

A parish is technically a piece of land. It's a section of a diocese that has the right number of churchgoers to have its own church. But when you refer to a parish, you're usually talking about more than the space itself. You're describing the people who attend the church, as well as the church property. The parish is the community of God's faithful that's been called together Members of a family are bound together by shared origins — siblings have the same parents, and all other relationships within the family derive in some way from the shared source of life. Members of a community are bound together by a common purpose — people join a community to engage in a work together, achieving a shared mission or goal.

The Church can be described as both a family and a community. We live with the life of Jesus Christ, claiming the One God as our Father. Sharing Jesus' life, we also share His mission. We are created and redeemed not for our own benefit alone, but to continue his active presence in our world, keeping alive the hope of eternal life in a world that would rather not acknowledge its need for God.

A family needs a home; a community needs a place to gather. The Church needs a structure. When I say structure, I don't just mean wood and plaster, steel and concrete. The structure of a community or a family is how relationships are organized to make the life of the people happen.

This weekend we celebrate our community. Many times when a parish history is written, it is told by describing the milestones of when what was built and by whom and the usual laundry list of founding pastors, presiding bishops, and serving priests. In teaching history, we have also taken that approach. A popular

critic, when reading Teddy Roosevelt's account of his service fighting in Cuba wrote that Roosevelt got the title of the book wrong, he should have called it "Alone in Cuba" because it was all about him. When we focus on the buildings, when we recall the names of the many priests who served here as pastors, we are failing to recognize that the community is not about the leaders, not about the buildings but about all of us. It is about the people who wash the linens, the people who show up to shovel snow, who fix things, who paint, who visit the sick, who gather during the week and on weekends to pray, just as American History should not be about rich white guys, our celebration while recognizing the leaders of the past and the legacy they left us, is really about celebrating every one of us, every member of this family who makes this parish a community which shares the discipleship of Jesus with each other and courageously with a world that does not like us very well.
