

The Baptism of the Lord – God's Right Here –



The church celebration of Jesus' baptism is better understood when explained with its counterpart, the Feast of the Epiphany. Epiphany shows Jesus' divine nature and purpose. The baptism shows Jesus as a human among humans, and as the chosen one of God. Jesus allowed John to baptize him, along with

thousands who stood on the riverbank. Against this background, it's hard to imagine an uninvolved God somewhere up in the sky. God himself became a creature with a body and soul "made in the likeness of God." With Jesus' baptism, God is no longer "over us," but he is in us and with us.


